

Remarks at St. Helena. 1860
Sunday Aug 19th these 24 hours light breeze with passing squalls of rain

Monday Aug 20th these 24 hours light breeze with pleasant weather. employed setting up rigging & taring down.

Tuesday Aug 21st these 24 hours light wind with passing squalls. employed taring the rigging & painting the spars. at 6 P.M. sent a Boat on shore George Waters one of the crew left the Boat without leaf. did not come on Board till 9 A.M.

Wednesday Aug 22^d these 24 hours light wind with passing squalls. employed painting the spars & taring the rigging. French Boatsteerer went on shore at 6 P.M. with orders to come on Board at 6 o'clock. He has not returned yet.

Thursday Aug 23^d these 24 hours light breeze. employed painting the ship & setting up shooks for water. French still on shore.

Friday Aug 24th these 24 hours Moderate breeze with some rain. employed setting up shooks. at 10 A.M. French came on Board.

Saturday Aug 25th these 24 hours pleasant weather at 11 A.M. the starboard watch went on liberty.

Sunday Aug 26th these 24 hours pleasant weather. at 6 A.M. the watch came on Board except Thomas Bell, Francis & Jamson. the Larboard watch went on liberty.

Monday Aug 27th these 24 hours pleasant weather the watch all came on Board & the other watch went on liberty.

Tuesday Aug 28th these 24 hours fresh breeze & squally at daylight the watch all came on Board & the other watch went on liberty. employed mending the sails.

Wednesday Aug 29th these 24 hours moderate breeze at 6 A.M. the watch all came on Board & the other watch went on liberty. Discharged Jamson. Thomas Bell still on shore.

Thursday Aug 30th these 24 hours pleasant weather employed getting off wood. the watch all came on Board. Bell Deserts.

Friday Aug 31st these 24 hours pleasant weather employed getting wood & water. Thomas Bell still on shore.

Saturday Sept 1st these 24 hours pleasant weather employed getting ready for sea. at 2 A.M. all ready the Captain came on Board to get underway but the steward was on shore & we did not go. the Captain had some trouble with John Blake. at 9 P.M. the Boat went in & John Blake & George Waters left the Boat without liberty. the Captain sent the Police after them. sent on shore two Barrels of sperm oil & two of Hump Back.

Sunday Sept 2^d these 24 hours fresh breeze & pleasant. all ready for sea waiting for the two Deserters.

Monday Sept 3^d Commences with a fresh breeze with passing squalls. Middle & latter parts the same at 7 A.M. the Captain came on Board & gave orders to get underway. He went on shore to wait for the two men that Deserted. at 10 A.M. got underway & stood out to the Eastward.

Tuesday Sept 4th Commences with a strong breeze & squally. heading to the Eastward. employed stowing anchors & Chains. at 4 P.M. tacked in shore. at 6 tacked to the Eastward the Island about 10 miles distant. Middle part wind & weather the same. latter part at 3 A.M. tacked in for the land. at noon the land about 6 miles distant.
