

Remarks on Board Bark Globe 1861

Wednesday March 27th Commences with a moderate breeze from the N.E. with cloudy weather. heading by the wind to the N.N.W. under easy sail. at sunset took in jib & Main sail. saw a whaling Brig. Middle & latter parts fresh breeze & cloudy. at noon tacked to the S.E. & saw a schooner.

Thursday March 28th Commences with a fresh breeze from the S.E. & cloudy weather. heading to the S.E. & at 6 P.M. spoke the Brig March off Matipouisse 30 lbs. sp. w. w. one ship to the N.W. Middle & latter parts fresh breeze from E. N.E. with passing squalls. heading to the North. saw two sail

Friday March 29th Commences with a fresh breeze from the E. N.E. with cloudy weather. heading to the North. at sunset took in jib & spanker & w. one ship to the S.E. Middle & latter parts moderate breeze & cloudy. saw a whaling Brig

Saturday March 30th Commences with a moderate breeze from the N.E. with passing squalls. heading to the N.N.W. at 4 P.M. tacked to the E. S.E. took in the fore topsail. Middle & latter parts moderate breeze & pleasant. saw a finback

Sunday March 31st Commences with a moderate breeze from the E. N.E. with pleasant weather. heading S.E. & saw two sail. Middle part at 12 w. one ship to the N.N.W. latter part fresh breeze with passing squalls saw a whale Brig

Cruising

Monday April 1st Commences with a fresh breeze from the N.E. with cloudy weather. heading N.N.W. at sunset took in fore topsail & jib. Middle & latter parts moderate breeze at 12 mid. w. one ship to the eastward.

Tuesday April 2nd Commences with a light breeze from the North. heading to the eastward. at 4 P.M. steered to the south. saw a Brig. at sunset shortened sail & hauled by the wind to the eastward. Middle & latter parts variable winds from North to West. at 10 A.M. double reefed the topsails. saw a Brig. employed rattring the mizzen rigging

Wednesday April 3rd Commences with a strong breeze from the westward. at 6 P.M. hauled to the North & squally took in fore topsail & close reefed the main w. one ship to the W. N.W. Middle & latter parts moderate breeze from the N.E. employed rattring down the rigging. saw a Brig

Thursday April 4th Commences with a moderate breeze from the W. S.W. with pleasant weather. heading to the South. spoke the Brig March at 8 P.M. w. one ship to the N.W. Middle & latter parts strong wind & ruggled. heading to the N.W. & at 11 A.M. took in the fore topsail

Friday April 5th Commences with strong wind from the westward. heading to the N.N.W. spoke the Bark Hellen off Edgartown. at 6 P.M. came up squally w. one ship to the South & close reefed the main top-sails Middle & latter parts strong wind from W. N.W. & squally. heading S.W. under short sail
