

Remarks on Board Park Globe. 1861.

Saturday April 6th Commences with a fresh gale from the W. & W. & a high sea. heading to the S.W. put the Boats on the upper cranes. saw a sail. Middle & latter parts fresh gale from the west with heavy squalls at 9 A.M. took in the fore sail. hove too under close reef. Main topsail. fore topmast ^{staysail} & spencers. heading S. S.W.

Sunday April 7th Commences with a fresh gale from West. with heavy squalls & a high sea. hove too heading S. S.W. at 8 P.M. wind hauled to the W. & W. Middle part the same. latter part at 4 A.M. wind began to moderate set the fore sail. passing squalls & a high swell

Monday April 8th Commences with a fresh breeze from the W. & W. heading to the South. under short sail. at 4 P.M. wore ship to the North. Middle and latter parts more moderate. heading to the North

Tuesday April 9th Commences with strong wind from the W. & W. & squally & a rough sea. heading to the North at 8 P.M. wind hauled to the N.W. wore ship to the W. S.W. Middle & latter parts Moderate breeze. at 6 A.M. wore ship to the North. set the fore topsail.

Wednesday April 10th Commences with a Moderate breeze from the W. & W. with a high swell. at 8 P.M. wind hauled to the N.W. wore ship to the W. S.W. Middle at 10 P.M. wore ship to the North. latter parts Moderate breeze from the W. S.W. & variable. at 9 A.M. wore ship to the South. saw an English ship steering to the Eastward. employed Rattling down the rigging

Thursday April 11th Commences with a light breeze from the S.W. with pleasant weather heading to the South saw Blackfish. chased them. got none. at 6 P.M. wore ship to the W. & W. & made sail. Middle & latter parts the same saw a sail.

Friday April 12th Commences with a fresh breeze from the S.W. with squally looking weather heading to the W. & W. at 8 P.M. took in main sail & jib. tightening in the S.W. Middle part the same. latter part squally. weather with rain. at 8 A.M. took in the fore topsail at 10 cleared up made sail. wind hauled to the N.W. employed Rattling the topmast rigging

Saturday April 13th Commences with a fresh breeze from the N.W. heading to the N.E. at 6 P.M. wore ship to the W. S.W. Middle part strong wind from the North & squally. steering W. & W. latter part wind hauled to the N.E. took in the jib & main sail. a high sea on. steering West. set whale watches.

Sunday April 14th Commences with strong wind from the N.E. with cloudy weather. & very rugged. steering West. under double reef topsails. Middle part wind more moderate. let the reefs out of the topsails latter part wind from the Eastward. & cloudy. steering West.
