

Bark Globe Cruising for whales year 1862

Tuesday June 24 This day commences with fine weather middle and latter part the same. the watch employed at ships duty so ends the day Lat 33° 28' North Long 52° 42' West

Wednesday June 25 This day commences with light breezes middle and latter part the same the watch employed at ships duty so ends the day Lat 33° 25' North Long 52° 15' West

Thursday June 26 This day commences with fresh breezes from the eastward with rain ship heading S S E middle and latter part light breezes and calms ship heading S E by E by the wind so ends the day Lat 33° 27' North Long 51° 50' West

Friday June 27 this day commences with moderate breezes from the S E and fair weather ship heading S E by E by the wind middle and latter part light breezes and calms ship heading to eastward by the wind at 4 M A M our cooper died his death ~~was~~ was caused by hard drinking his name was George Drichon Eighteen days out when he died had ran off from duty ever since leaving home he was thirty one years of age so ends the day Lat 34° 05' North Long 50° 42' West

Saturday June 28 This day commences with moderate breezes and calm weather at P M we read over a Chapter in the bible and buried him in the deep middle and latter part wind and weather the same the watch employed at ship duty at 1 M at night saw a steamship to men sick so ends the day Lat 34° 10' North Long 50° 04' West

Sunday June 29 This day commences with light weather and baffling winds heading S by the wind to the Northward and Eastward middle part light winds latter part moderate breezes from the westward steering S E the watch employed at ship duty so ends the day to men sick Lat 34° 05' North Long 48° 44' West

Remarks on board the Bark Globe year 1862

Monday June 30th This day commences with a moderate breeze from the Southward and westward steering S E with passing squalls middle and latter part wind and weather the same one sail in sight the watch employed at ship duty so ends the day Lat 34° 25' North Long 48° 24' West

Tuesday July 1st This day commences with a strong breeze from the S W steering S E by E moderate double reefed top sail breeze with cloudy weather at daylight made sail middle and latter part wind and weather the same the watch employed at ship duty two men sick so ends the day Lat 33° 50' North Long 46° 32' West

Wednesday July 2nd This day commences with a moderate breeze from the westward steering S by E with pleasant weather at one P M spoke the bark St. Banchina of Provencetown thirteen months out 3000 lbs sperm 300 humpback middle and latter part wind and weather the same the watch employed at ship duty so ends the day Lat 34° 15' North Long 46° 00' West

Thursday July 3rd This day commences with pleasant weather wind from the southward and westward steering N N W at sundown shortened sail heading by the wind middle and latter part wind and weather the same the watch employed at ship duty two men sick so ends the day Lat 35° 06' North Long 45° 35' West

Friday July 4th This day commences with a strong breeze from the northward with passing squalls under double reefed top sails steering by the wind with the wind from the northward at sundown shortened sail middle part strong breeze latter part more moderate the watch employed at ship duty two men sick so ends the day Lat 35° 35' North Long 44° 27' West
