Saturday July 5th This day commences with fine weather wind from the Northward and Eastward Steering S & at 8 A.M. raised sperm whales lowered at 5 P.M. struck at one o'clock at night took the whale alongside middle and latter part the wind and weather the same one sail in sight two men sick the mast boat got stove

Sunday July 6th This day commences with fine weather wind very light at 7 A.M. commenced cutting at 6 P.M. finished cutting in the body moderate breeze from the westward heading by the wind saw steam ship and a bark steering to the Southward and Eastward two men sick so ends the day

Monday July 7th This day commences with pleasant weather fished the four top sail case alongside at daylight commenced cutting the head at twelve o'clock finished cutting blowing strong from the Southward and westward quite rugged one sail in sight two men sick so ends the day

Tuesday July 8th This day commences with a strong breeze from the Southward and westward heading by the wind at one P.M. commenced boiling quite rugged but clear weather middle and latter part wind and weather the same employed boiling two men sick so ends the day

Wednesday July 9th This day commences with a strong breeze from the westward and rugged weather one sail in sight middle and latter part wind and weather the same employed boiling two men sick so ends the day

Remarks on board Bark Gloe in the year 1862

Thursday July 10th This day commences with a strong breeze from the Southward and westward with rugged weather heading by the wind employed boiling at 6 A.M. finished boiling middle and latter part wind and weather the same two men sick so ends the day

Friday July 11th This day commences with a more moderate breeze from the westward at one P.M. spoke the Bark Willis of Nantucket thirteen months out 7 A.M. 180 humpback middle and latter part wind and weather the same tacked and retacked steering by the wind two men sick so ends the day

Saturday July 12th This day commences with a moderate breeze from the westward heading by the wind at 6 A.M. raised sperm whales at 6 A.M. lowered at 7 struck but dived from him chased but did not get on again at 1 P.M. came on board made sail and chased middle and latter part wind and weather the same employed cooping oil two men sick so ends the day

Sunday July 13th This day commences with pleasant weather tacked and retacked steering by the wind the wind from the westward at sunset whales in sight about four miles off double reefed the top sails at daylight made sail middle and latter part wind and weather the same employed cooping and stowing down oil two men sick so ends the day

Monday July 14th This day commences with fine weather and a moderate breeze from the westward tacked and retacked steering by the wind at sundown shortened sail finished stowing down oil at daylight made sail two sail in sight employed setting up stumps middle and latter part wind and weather the same so ends
