Tuesday July 15th This day commences with fine weather tacked and relatched steering by the wind with the wind from the westward at sunset shortened sail for the night at daylight made sail middle and latter part the wind and weather the same two men sick so ends the day

Wednesday July 16th This day commences with fine weather steering S E with the wind from the Northward and westward at 2 P.M. raised sperm whales lower and chased but did not get on at 6 P.M. came on board hauled by the wind heading N W by W one ship in sight at sunset shortened sail at daylight made all sail at 6 A.M. raised sperm whales at 6 M. lowered middle and latter part wind and weather the same three men sick so ends the day

Thursday July 17th This day commences with fine weather from the westward at 2 P.M. struck at 4 P.M. had him along side at daylight commenced cutting at noon finished cutting in his body one sail in sight middle and latter part wind and weather the same three men sick so ends the day

Friday July 18th This day commences with fine weather at 5 P.M. finished cutting in the head at 9 P.M. commenced boiling middle and latter part wind and weather the same one sail in sight employed boiling three men sick so ends the day

Saturday July 19th This day commences with fine weather wind from the Southward and westward heading by the wind one sail in sight middle and latter part wind and weather the same employed boiling one sail in sight three men sick so ends the day

Remarks on Board the Bark Globe in the year 1862

Sunday July 20th This day commences with pleasant weather with strong breeze from the southward and westward heading by the wind at 9 P.M. finished boiling one sail in sight middle and latter part wind and weather the same three men sick so ends the day

Monday July 21st This day commences with cloudy squally weather at 4 P.M. wore ship and stood by the wind to the Northward and westward wind from the W middle and latter part wind and weather the same employed at ship's duty one sail in sight three men sick so ends the day

Tuesday July 22nd This day commences with squally rainy weather at 7 P.M. wore ship and stood by the wind to the South and westward at 1 P.M. passed Long with a Spanish ship and exchanged signals with an American brig steering to the Northward middle and latter part wind and weather the same employed breaking out to stow down oil three men sick so ends the day

Wednesday July 23rd This day commences with a strong breeze from the westward with passing squalls steering by the wind saw a black one whaler in sight on the southward tack employed stowing down oil middle and latter part wind and weather the same three men sick so ends the day

Thursday July 24th This day commences with pleasant weather and strong breeze from the westward steering by the wind saw a black but did not find out what it was middle and latter part wind and weather the same employed at ship's duty to men sick so ends Lat 35.45 N Lon 42.43 W
