

Bark Globe Cruising for Sperm Whales in the year 1862

Thursday August 14th This day commences with squally weather bound to Sularis at sunset sighted the Island of Sularis distance about 28 miles Steering N.E. by N. one point on our starboard bow at dark double reefed the topsails and ran for the land until 12 o'clock then hauled aback and lay until daylight then run down to the land and the Captain and boatswain went ashore to get recruits the ship laying off and on in company with the Bark George and Mary of Westport 21 months out 160 lbs sperm oil. at sunset got our recruits on board and stood out to sea wind from the westward so ends the day

Friday August 15th This day commences with a fresh breeze from the westward Steering S. all sail out. one sail in sight the Island of Sularis in sight. middle part Steering N. by E. wind from the Northward latter part the same. the watch employed at ships duty so ends the day

Saturday August 16th This day commences with a moderate breeze from the Northward Steering N. by E. with pleasant weather two sail in sight middle and latter part wind and weather the same the watch employed at ships duty so ends the day

Sunday August 17th This day commences with a moderate breeze from the Northward Steering N. by E. with pleasant weather one sail in sight middle and latter part wind and weather the same the watch employed at ships duty so ends the day

Monday August 18th This day commences with pleasant weather wind S. by E. Steering N. middle part from the N. Steering by the heading N. by W. employed setting up shucks one sail in sight so ends the day

Tuesday August 19th This day commences with pleasant weather wind from the westward Steering by the wind heading N. by W. middle and latter part wind and weather the same the watch employed at ships duty so ends the day

Wednesday August 20th This day commences with pleasant weather Steering by the wind to the westward at sunset took in sail one ship in sight at daylight made all sail wind from the South and Eastward Steering N. by S four sail in sight at 12 o'clock midday passed Signalls with an American ship Steering N. the watch employed at ships duty so ends the day

Thursday August 21th This day commences with pleasant weather wind from the South and Eastward Steering N. by S at sunset took in sail at daylight made all sail wind from the South and westward Steering by the wind heading N. by S middle and latter part wind and weather the same the watch employed at ships duty so ends the day

Friday August 22 This day commences with cloudy squally weather at sunset double reefed the topsails at daylight made sail blowing a fresh breeze from the North and westward Steering by the wind heading S. W. by W. and W. S. W. with rain middle and latter part wind and weather the same the watch employed at ship duty one sail in sight so ends the day

Saturday August 23 This day commences with rainy squally weather under double reefed topsails at 4 P.M. raised a beach made sail and run for it but did not see it again at sunset shortened sail wind from the south steering by the wind middle and latter part wind and weather the same.
