Monday Sept 1st This day commences with pleasant weather
wind from the Eastward steering N.W. by N. on sail
in sight. Middle and latter parts wind and weather
the same employed at Ship Day Sept 1st obs 33. 15. N.
Sun by alt. 38. 28. W.

Tuesday Sept 2^d This day commences with a fresh breeze from
the Southward and Eastward steering by the wind to the
E.N.E. with passing squalls saw a breach run for it but did
not prove to be any thing else but Plamfaced at sunset shot
sail at daylight but the mainsail and fib
Lat by obs 32. 12. N.
Sun by alt. 38. 29. W.

Wednesday Sept 3^d day commences with a strong breeze
from the Eastward backed and retarded steering
by the wind under double reef topsails went rigged at
sunset furled the fib and mainsail saw Plamfaced
at daylight made sail at 11 AM raised a school of
sperm whales at 1/2 land Middle and latter parts
wind and weather the same Lat by obs 32. 6. N.
Sun by alt.

Thursday Sept 4th This day commences with pleasant weather
at 2 PM struck got two whales and a calf at sunset
got them alongside and fluked on sail in sight at
11 AM commenced cutting Middle and latter parts
steering by the wind to the Northward and Eastward on
sail in sight breeze from the Eastward

Lat by obs 33. 16. N.
Sun by alt. 38. 28. W.



Remarks on Board Back Globe the year 1862

Friday Sept 5th This day commences with pleasant weather
with now and then a passing squall at 2 PM now sail
and stood by the wind to the Southward & Eastward
at 7 PM commenced billing the sail in sight at
10 1/2 after watch spoke a big breid to New York and passed
longitude at 6 AM was ship and stood by the wind
to the Northward and Eastward employed billing
Lat by obs 32. 4. N.
Sun by alt. 38. 29. W.

Saturday Sept 6th This day commences with a strong breeze from
the Southward and Eastward heading by the wind to the
the Northward and Eastward employed billing saw
jumped heaving at sunset furled the foretop sail squalls
rugged at 2 o'clock at night finished blowing strong
Lat by obs 32. 5. N.
Sun by alt. 38. 29. W.

Sunday Sept 7th This day commences with a gale of wind
from the Southward heading by the wind to the
E.N.E. under close reef mainsail and fore sail
Middle and latter parts wind and weather the same
employed at Ship Day Lat by obs " "
Sun by alt. " "

Monday Sept 8th This day commences with a gale from the
Southward blowing more strong under close reef mainsail
and fore sail at 4 PM passed signal with a English
ship steering to the Northward and Eastward latter part
a little more moderate three sail in sight

Lat by obs 33. 2. N.
Sun by alt. 38. 29. W.
