Remarks Friday June 30th 1865 - 4th Day
First part Moderate Breeze from the South.
Heading E.S.E. Saw 83 Fish. Latter part
Moderate Breeze from the South.
Employed getting the Cutting Beer, sent the
Peasants Afloat. Lat 37-50 Long 66-15

Remarks Saturday July 1st 5th Day
First part Moderate Breeze from
the S. heading to the E.S.E. George
Wilton Boat Steerer has had several
fits. he had but just got on Deck from
aloft, one man sick with the venereal.
Latter part Moderate Breeze from S. heading E.S.E.
Lat 37-24 Long 66-26

Remarks Sunday July 2nd 6th Day
First part Moderate Breeze from S.W.,
heading to the Westward. Wilton had more
fits. I declare it is too bad. I must try to get
him home. And I am lame sick my self. I
hope God will bless me with good luck so that I
can get home with a good baggage and a short one.
I am going to do as near right as I can hoping
for the best. Latter part Moderate Breeze from
S.W. heading to the Westward. I have been
very lonely to day. My Colic and Cough is bad.
What are my friends doing to night. do my Miss
one. I think so. Lat 37-23 Long 65-46

Remarks Monday July 3rd 7th Day
First part Moderate Breeze from S.W. Steady
to the Westward. Saw two Sails. Middle and Latter
part Squally. at 2 P.M. turned to the Southward.
under Double Reefed Ship Sails.
Lat 37-36 Long 65-26

Remarks Tuesday July 4th 1865 - 8th Day
First part Squally Wind from S.W. heading
to the S.E. Wilton had more fits. I should
be very thankful if I could get a wine
to get some where so I could see some vessel
so that I could send him home.

Latter part Moderate Breeze from N.W. S.W.
Steering S.W. at 6 1/2 raised Spruce Whales, at 7 lowered
the Boat the S Boat struck one and lancee another
but lost the run of him. the Whales would not
stop. at 9 took what along side and prepared
cut. at 10 1/2 began Cutting Spoke an English Steamer
Lat 37-13 Long 65-27

Remarks Wednesday July 5th 8th
This is the evening the 14th. What are
my friends doing to night - how I celebra-
te the 4th by getting a whale as I wished
when I was at home. though a small one
he is worth 20 Dollars to me. better than nothing
my dog is sick and will not eat anything.
I think a great deal of him because you tell me
5 sick men. no cares are all that I can take
care of. Latter part fresh Breeze from
W. S.W. heading S. at 7 P.M. commenced sailing.
Lat 35-26 Long 65-05

Remarks Thursday July 6th 10th
First part Strong Breeze from W. S.W. heading S.
at 5 P.M. I double reefed the Ship Sails I wish I could
be at home to night with my friends. I am lame sick
enough. never more so in all my going to sea. Middle and
Latter parts Squally. at 10 P.M. finished sailing.
at 9 P.M. the China Sailed to the Northward!
Middle Sail and Steerer W.
Lat 34-00 Long 66-33
