Remarks Thursday Aug 31st 66th Day.
 First part fine weather Employed boiling and
 clearing away the whale. Latter part moderate.
 Breeze from S.W. Lat 31-54 Long 31-53

Remarks Friday Sep 1st 67th Day.
 First part fresh breeze from S. heading W.S.W.
 Employed boiling macle and latter part fresh S.W.
 Boiling under double reefed main top sail and fore sail.

Lat 41-50 Long 32-00

Remarks Saturday Sep 2nd 68th Day.
 First part blowing a Gale from the South.
 have too heading to the westward under double reefed
 main top sail and fore sail. At 3 o'clock down and
 close reefed the main top sail and furled the fore
 sail. There is a bad sea running. I hope we shall
 save our ship. we have about 110 or 120 bbls on
 deck. we have done all we can to save it. the
 result is with God. and we must trust him with
 it. Barometer 29⁷/₁₀ middle part strong Gale. at
 12 rained hard and the wind veered to the westward
 Latter part moderated some. But a very
 heavy irregular sea running. at 8 A.M. started
 the works again. to scald the case gave
 a small whaling & barks steering to the
 eastward. finished boiling the whale.
 he turned up 114 bbls. a good whale
 and I feel very thankful for him too.

Remarks Monday Sep 4th 69th Day.
 First part strong winds from W.S.W. steering S.E.
 under double reef. at sundown took the fore &
 main top sails and wore ship to the N.W.
 Latter part fresh Gale from S.W. lying too under a double
 reefed main top sail and fore sail. Barometer 30

Lat 42-14 Long 32-00

Remarks Tuesday Sep 5th 70th Day.
 First part fresh Gale from S.W. heading S.W. by W.
 under a double reefed main top sail and fore sail.
 Barometer 30 Latter part strong Gale and squally.
 Ship under double reefed main top sail and stay
 sails. Employed cooping and stowing down oil
 between decks Barometer 29⁷/₁₀

Remarks Wednesday Sep 6th 71st Day.
 First part fresh Gale from the N.W. and
 heavy squalls. Ship under double reefed main
 top sail and stay sails. Employed cooping
 and stowing down oil between decks.
 and 3 P.M. cleared off and moderated some.
 at 7 P.M. wore ship to the S.W. Barometer 29¹⁰/₁₀
 Latter part strong Gale from W.S.W. and
 heavy squalls. At 7 1/2 P.M. close reefed the
 main top sail and furled the fore sail.
 Barometer 29⁷/₁₀.
