Remarks Thursday Sept 7th 1865. 23rd
First part fresh Gale from N.W. and
heavy squalls. have too heading to the westward
under close reefed main top sail and stay sail.
Barometer 29.90 and slowly rising. Latter part -
Moderate and a heavy swell. finishing stowing oil.
Stowed 1183 lbs 28 1/2 Gall. Lat 41-56 Long 32-19
Barometer 30 1/10

Remarks Friday Sept 8th. 24th Day.
First part fresh breezes from W. & N.W. heading
S under whole top sails. At 6 P.M. Double reefed.
Barometer 30 1/10. Latter part fresh Gale from S.W. by W.
at 2 P.M. took in the fore and main top sails.
Barometer 30 1/10 Lat 40-58 Long 31-03

Remarks Saturday Sept 9th. 25th Day.
First part fresh Gale from W. & N.W. heading
to the South under Double reefed main top sail
and fore sail. Barometer 30 1/10. Latter part -
Strong Gale at 10 P.M. took the fore sail. at 5 A.
M. close reefed the main top sail. Barometer 30-
Lat 40-45 Long 30-02

Remarks Sunday Sept 10th 26th Day.
First part strong Gale from S.W. have too
under close reefed main top sail. heading S.E.
Another Sunday is past and gone. and still a Gale
of wind. Latter part raining. Barometer 31-

Remarks Monday 11th Sept. 27th Day.
Begins with fresh Gale from S.W. and rising.
at 4 moderate a little. Set the fore and wore
ship to the westward. Barometer 31.
Latter part still a Gale of wind. Well the Lord will
change it all in his own good time. It is tedious
but it cannot be helped. Barometer 30 15/100
Lat 40-51 Long 30-03

Western gales & Jennings

Remarks Tuesday Sept 12th 1865. 28th
Begins with still a Gale of wind from S.W.
heading to the westward under close reefed
top sail. At 6 P.M. took the fore and main top
sails. Barometer 30 15/100. at 7 P.M. had a short squall
of rain. then moderate and the wind hauled the N.W.
Latter part - Calm. at 10 P.M. took a breeze from N.W. made
all sail. Barometer 30 1/10 Lat 40-38 Long 30-05

Remarks Wednesday Sept 13th. 29th Day.
Begins with pleasant breeze from N.W. by N.
steering N.W. at 4 P.M. raised the land of
Barro bearing S.W. Dist 40 miles. at 6 took in
top sail. Latter part fresh breezes from W. & N.W.
clear ahead. at noon the Island bearing W by S Dist 40
miles. Barometer 30 1/10 Lat 39-50 Long 30-40

Remarks Thursday Sept 14th. 30th Day.
Begins with strong winds from the west. and
increasing. at 3 P.M. under close reefed top sails.
blowing strong, and rising. Barometer 30 15/100. Barro bearing
W Dist 25 miles. Latter part fresh Gale from
W by S. steering South by E. under close reefed top
sails. Barometer 30 1/10 Lat 38-53 Long 29-34

Remarks Friday Sept 15th. 31st Day.
Begins with fresh Gale from W by S. steering
S & E under close reefed top sails at 5 P.M.
luffed too. at 5 1/2 raised the land of Barro
bearing S & E Dist 25 miles. at 6 1/2 wore
ship to the N.W. Latter part moderate breezes
from S.W. and heavy swell. steering for Barro.
at 10 A.M. bent the chains and got the anchors
off the bow. at noon land bearing S & E
Dist 5 miles.
