 Oct - 30 & 31 & 1st Jan. Lat 34-54

 Remarks Sunday Feb 4th 222nd
 First part moderate breeze from E & E.
 head to the South. at 8 P.M. put away Mo.
 mill. Strong winds and rain took the
 Mizzen & Main top sails, and double reefed the Fore
 and Main top sails. Latter part strong winds.
 I have thought much of home too day.
 About meeting time I wandered off of me. I
 thought of the times we have taken ice cream
 together. And of the time that I sat
 top of my arm when she got started so when we
 were crossing Kempton Street that night -
 because I would not let her run. And she
 lagged along behind and would not walk
 with me. I do believe she would too
 night if she had the chance. O dear, goodnight,

 Remarks Thursday Feb 7th 226th Day.
 First part light air and calm. Bar 30⁹/₁₀
 Latter part light air from the South. Sent down
 and repaired the Main top sail. Lat 32-17

Remarks Friday Feb 8th 227th Day.
 Begins with calm. at 3 P.M. took a fresh
 breeze from Eastward. Saw a merchant
 bark. Latter part strong winds from N by E.
 steering N by W under double reef.

Lat 32-20 Long 47-29
 Remarks Saturday Feb 9th 228th Day.
 Begins with strong winds from N by E.
 under double reef. at 6 P.M. took in the
 Fore and Mizzen top sails. Latter part
 a heavy tempest. at 11 Clear off.

Lat 32-38 Long 47-30
 Remarks Sunday Feb 10th 229th Day.
 First part light air and calm with a
 heavy swell. Latter part pleasant breeze
 from the North. saw Driftnets and a
 number of ships. Another bark Sunday
 is past. My mice has been at home
 too day. No whales yet. Where are they.
 It is too bad. I should like to see
 my specimens to night. do they think
 of me as I do of them. Sunday
 is the most lonesome day with me.
