Begins with moderate breezes from W. & W.
steering N by W. Latter part fresh breezes
from W. & W. saw a steamer. Employed repairing
the Main Mast Sail. Lat 31-43 Long 49-26

Remarks Wednesday Feb 13th 232
Begins with fresh breezes from S.W.
and a heavy swell. Steering N.E. at sundown
luffed to the S.E. Latter part Calm. saw
a steamer. Lat 31-32 Long 28-06

Remarks Thursday Feb 14th 233 Day.
First part moderate breezes from N.W.
saw a steamer and a schooner. Latter part
fresh breezes from the S. and a heavy swell.
Lat 30-37 Long 48-22

Remarks Friday Feb 15th 234
First part fresh breezes from South
steering to the West. saw three ships.
at 6 P.M. wore ship to the E & S.E.
Latter part - calm. Employed repairing the
Old Mizzen Mast Sail. Lat 30-17

Remarks Saturday Feb 16th 235th
First part light air from East. Steering
S. Latter part moderate breezes saw sails
and a steamer. O where are the whales.
What shall we do without - whales.

First part - pleasant breezes from East
steering to the South. & exchanged signals with
a British ship. saw a steamer.

wish there was some way for me to get a good
living at home without being obliged to follow
this uncertain business. and I thought of by these
I have at home. how is my wife and children
too bright. And my sister too; does she think of

First part fresh breezes from N.E. steering
S.W. at 3 P.M. luffed to. Latter part strong
winds. steering to N.W. under double reef.

Begins with strong winds from N.E. steering
W. & W. under double reef. at 5 P.M. wore
ship to the S.E. Latter part strong breezes.
Lat 34-10 Long 48-51

Remarks Wednesday Feb 20th 239
Begins with fresh breezes from N.E. & E. steering
to the S.E. under double reef. Latter part strong
winds. Course S.W. Lat 35-28 Long 47-06

Remarks Thursday Feb 21st 240th
Begins with strong from N.N.E. course S.W. & W. under double
reef. Latter part strong and squally from S.W.
Lat 36-10 Long 50-20

Remarks Friday Feb 22nd 241st
Begins with moderate breeze from S.W. at 4 P.M. took in Main and
Mizzen Mast Sails. Latter part strong winds under double
reef. Lat 36-22
