First part fresh & breezy from S.E. Latter
 part moderate. O Sea. I have got to go in with no more
 Oil. well I cannot help it. Lat 28-28 Long 45-53

Remarks Thursday March 29th 235th
First part moderate & breezy from S.E. Steady
 to N.W. for St. Catharines. Latter part light airs
 from S.E. Employed fitting the gang way.

Lat 27-45 Long 47-14
Remarks Friday March 30th 236
First part light & breezy from S.E. Course by N.
 At 2 P.M. made the Island St. Catharines
 bearing N.W. 1/4 N. Dist 55 miles. Latter part light
 air from the N. Working up the land. At noon the middle
 of the Island bearing N.W. Dist 10 miles.

Remarks Saturday March 31st. 237th.
First part fresh & breezy from N.E. Working
 up the land of two other sails doing the same.
 At dark the N. end of the Island bearing N.W.
 Dist 28 miles. the nearest land bearing N.W. Dist
 15 miles. heading N.W. by N. N.W. by N.
 Latter part light and baffling with a strong current.
 gained only 1/4 miles in 24 hours.

Ship Alfred Gibbs. at St. Catharines. E. Evening

Remarks Sunday April 1st 1866. 238th Day.
First part light & breezy from the N.E. weather
 up the land. a strong southerly current. Spoke the
 Marcella. Chase of N. B. Capt. At 5 P.M. civil
 time came to anchor at St. Catharines in five
 fathoms water. Strong winds and rain. heavy
 squalls. The Osprey and Mary Brazier came in one
 yesterday and day to day. God Ancharage 5 ft.

(The fullan House bearing N.W. by N. water
 By men's deserting, and the impossibility
 of getting more we had to lay in St. Catharines
 14 weeks, and then sailed five men short.

Remarks Monday May 1st 1866. 321st
At 6 1/2 A.M. took out anchor and sailed
 from St. Catharines. At 11 anchored it being
 head tide and calm. At noon took a
 breeze from N.N.E. took the anchor and
 began to beat out. Part Santa Cruz bearing
 N.W. Dist 4 miles.

Remarks Tuesday May 2nd 322
First moderate & breezy from N.N.E. beating
 out of St. Catharines. At 6 P.M. passed
 the head and put away S.E.
 Latter part steering S. Lat 28-56 Long 47-57

Remarks Wednesday May 3rd 323
First part fresh & breezy from N.N.E.
 Course S.W. At 3 P.M. the wind hauled
 to the westward and blew on. Double Reef.
 At 10 1/2 took in fore and main sail. Close
 Reefed the fore and main. Began. Began. Began.
 Barometer 29.8/10 Lat 31-07
