 increasing. At 4 P.M. took in Bare Sail.
 Bare and Mizzen Top Sails. Close reefed the
 Main Top Sail. Barometer 29 1/10
 Latter part fresh Gale. At 10 Moderated some.
 Set close reefed Top Sails and Bare Sail.
 Barometer 29 1/10 Lat 31-57

Remarks Friday May 18th 325th
 Begins with strong winds from the west,
 backing to the S. Under Double Reef. At
 5 hauled the S & C and began to rain.
 wore ship to the S.W. At 12 1/2 took
 the wind again from the westward. Middle
 and Latter part strong and increasing. At 6 A
 M took in fore and Main Sail. At 11 1/2 the fore
 and Mizzen Top Sails, heavy squalls. Lat 32-59 Long 48-29

Remarks Saturday May 19th 326th
 Begins with a Gale from the West have too
 heading S.W. Under Double Reefed Main Top
 Sail and Bare Sail. At 4 P.M. took the Bare Sail
 and close reefed the Main Top Sail. Latter part
 strong Gale and very heavy squalls. Lat 33-23
 Barometer 30-

Remarks Sunday May 20th 326th Day
 Begins with a Gale from the S.W. have too heading
 S.W. Under Close Reefed Main Top Sail. At 4 Moderated
 Set the Bare Sail. Barometer 30- middle and
 Latter part moderate with a heavy swell. At 10 A.M.
 took a light breeze from the N. Course ship's.
 Saw a sail steering to the westward.
 Lat 33-33 Long 47-48

 Begins with moderate breezes from the N. Course
 ship's. A heavy swell from the S. All sail set.
 Barometer 30 1/10. Middle and Latter part strong

 squall of thunder and rain. took in the Bare Sail. Bare
 and Mizzen Top Sails. Close reefed the Main. Barometer
 29 65/100

Remarks Tuesday May 22nd 328th Day.
 Begins with a Gale of winds from the S.W. with
 very heavy squalls of thunder and lightning.
 with rain and hail have too under Close Reefed
 Main Top Sail heading to the south. Barometer 29 1/10
 Latter part still a Gale. Lat 34-56

Remarks Wednesday May 23rd 329th Day
 Begins with a Gale from the S.W. heavy squalls
 have too under Close Reefed Main Top Sail.
 Barometer 29 1/10 Latter part a Gale. at 4 A.M. the
 wind hauled to the south. Lat 34-56 Long 46-31

Remarks Thursday May 24th 330th
 Begins with fresh Gale from the south. But
 moderating set the Bare Sail. at 4 set the fore
 and Mizzen Top Sails. Squally with thunder
 and lightning. Barometer 30 1/10 Latter part strong
 winds and squally. Under Double Reef.
 Lat 34-17 Long 47-02

Remarks Friday May 25th 331st
 Begins with fresh breezes from the N. heading
 S.W. Under Double Reef. Barometer 30-3/10
 Latter part light and baffling.
 Lat 34-24 Long 46-29
