south. Barometer 29 7/10 Thermometer 61

Remarks Monday June 18th 356th
First-part-fresh Breeze from the W and squally
saw 8 Drunks ran for them. Observed a flock
of Pin Backs, with one Wright-Out One side.
lowered for him at 4 1/2 P.M. I & Boat struck
only half an hour daylight the whale
ran to the windward. at 6 cut the line
and let him go. the first one that we
have been fast to for seven months.
middle part-heavy squalls. Ship under close
reef Main Top Sail. Latter part more moderate
under Double Reef. Lat 40-11 Bar. 29 9/10

Remarks Tuesday June 19th 357th
First-part-Strong Winds from W.S.W. and
rough. Saw a Wright-to the windward and
going to the windward. did not lower.
6000 Backs water. Latter part-fresh Breeze
and rough. under Double Reef. Bar. 29 7/10 Therm. 39

Remarks Saturday June 23rd 361st
First-part-Strong Winds from the S.W.
trying to get to the S.W. with a Strong
Sultry wind and S.E. current - it is hard
work. Saw plenty of Pin Backs. Bar. 30 1/10
Latter part-Calm. Caught some Fish. and
number of Dogfish. Saw Whiting and a kind
of rock Cod. One Skate. Bar. 30 1/10

Lat 39-09 Long 56-14

Remarks Sunday June 24th 362nd Day
First-part-Calm. Latter part-light Breeze
from W.S.W. and fine. at 2 1/2 P.M. saw a small
Wright-whale. at 4 lowered the boats. at 4 1/2 the W.B.
struck. at noon the whale was dead. Bar. 30 1/10

Lat 40-03 Long 57-19

Remarks Monday June 25th 363rd
First-part-light Breeze from W.S.W. at 4 1/2
took the whale to the ship. at 3 1/2 P.M. commenced
to cut. at 6 finished. made sail and started
to the south. Latter part-fine. wind N.W.
saw Wright-whales lowered no success.
Pin Backs started them. batting about.
Barometer 30 1/10
