First-part Drizzling and squally and squally from
S.W. to S.E. Bar 30 1/2. Latter part Drizzling and
squally. No Obs

Remarks Friday July 20th 388th
First-part Drizzling and squally from S.W. to
S.E. at 5 P.M. double reefed. Heading to the Eastward.
Barometer very high 30 1/2. Latter part calm. Caught some
fish. in both water. Lat 40-30 Long 60-00

Remarks Saturday July 21st 389th
First-part light breeze from N. Steering S by E.
I am going to look for sperm whales. And hope I shall
have better luck. Tomorrow is my birth day. Let us
pray it is possible. Latter part moderate breeze
N.W. by N. course S.E. by S. Barometer 30 1/2. Lat 41-57 Long 58-49

Remarks Sunday July 22nd 390th
First-part moderate breeze from N.W. by N.
Course S.E. by S. Saw 1000 birds. Struck a porpoise
Latter part thick. Bar 30 3/4 Lat 43-25 No Obs

Remarks Monday July 23rd 391st
First-part moderate breeze from N.W. and foggy
course S.E. Bar 30 1/2. Saw one bird. Lat 44-17
part moderate. No Obs

Remarks Tuesday July 24th 392nd
First-part moderate breeze from N.W. Course
S.E. Latter part Drizzling and foggy.
Barometer 30 Thermometer 40
No Obs

First-part moderate breeze from the South and
thick weather Barometer 30. Latter part fresh
breeze. Bar 30-1/2 Thermometer 37.
Lat 46-50 Long 58-45

Remarks Thursday July 26th 394th
First-part moderate from the South. trying to get
to the South. Latter part moderate. Barometer 30 3/4
Thermometer 37 Lat 46-54 Long 58-19

Remarks Friday July 27th 395th
First-part light air from South and calm. Bar 30 1/2
Latter part light air from the N.W. Steering S.E.
for Port Stanley. Falkland Islands. Thermometer 38
Lat 47-26 No Obs

Remarks Saturday July 28th 396th
First-part fresh breeze from N.W. and thick
course S.E. Barometer 30 1/2. Bar. Therm. 40
Latter part strong winds and thick. at 9 A.M. took
in main. top. sail. and double reefed. No Obs.
Bar. 29 3/4 by calculation 50-15-

Remarks Sunday July 29th 397th
First-part strong winds from N.W. by W. Steering S.E.
for Port Stanley. Lower double reefed. Main & Indian topails
and bare sail. at 5 P.M. took in bare top sail and
luffed too. heading S.W. Suppose the nearest land
is 35 miles bearing S. Barometer 29 1/2. Ther. 40
Latter part fresh breeze and thick fog. at 5 A.M.
put off S.E. No Obs

Remarks Monday July 30th 398th
Begins with moderate breeze from W. N.W. Steering S.E.
run the lat out. saw one lance. Supposed strong easterly current
at 3 P.M. luffed too heading to the S.W. thick fog. at 6 went to the N.W.
Latter part fresh breeze and thick fog. wind N.W. Hood
four hours on. then off all night. at 6 A.M. made the
light at Port Stanley. two points off the Lee & Dow. One
