Latter part strong winds, under double reef.

Begins with strong winds from S.E. under double
reef. at 6 P.M. took in fore and main top sails.
Latter part strong winds. Lat 42-34 Long 16-59

Remarks Tuesday Feb 12th. 595th
Begins with strong winds from S.E. heading by
to the East under double reef. Latter part moderate
employed repairing the L & Boat.

Remarks Wednesday Feb 13th 596th
Begins with light breezes from S.W. Spoke
the Vineyard of Eggartown Smith Master & Manth
Chen. Latter part moderate breezes from the N.
staring S.E. at noon Huaf bearing E.S.E. Dist 25 miles
Lat 43-33

Remarks Thursday Feb 14th 597th
Begins with fresh breezes from N. at 5 P.M.
double reef. at 6 began to rain took in fore and
main top sails. Huaf bearing E.N.E. Dist 25 miles
heading N.W. by N. Middle and latter parts a Gale
from N to W.N.W. under close reefed main top sail
and fore sail reef. heavy squalls of rain.

Remarks Friday Feb 15th 598th Day.
Begins with a Gale from the N.W. under close
reef. main top sail and reefed fore sail. at 4
P.M. began to moderate. Latter part strong winds
from the South at noon Huaf bearing S.E. Dist.
35 miles. Lat 43-02.

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Remarks Saturday Feb 16th 1867. 599th
Begins with strong southerly winds and heavy sea.
under double reef. Latter part moderate.
at noon Huaf bearing E.S.E. Dist 35 miles.

Remarks Sunday Feb 17th 1867. 600th
Begins with light breezes from the South.
at 7 P.M. Huaf bearing E.S.E. Dist 30 miles calm.
Latter part calm. Saw 10 Backs. Lat 43-07

Remarks Monday Feb 18th. 601st
Begins with calm. The 83 Mars in sight. Huaf Dist
40 miles. Latter part light breezes from the S
and smooth. at 7 A.M. saw the Mars whaling
1 mile to the windward of us. at 10 lowered
the 83 boats. at noon the L and W 83 boats
lost to two whales. Huaf bearing E.S.E. by
compass Dist 35 miles.

Remarks Tuesday Feb 19th. 602nd
Begins with light breezes from S.W. and
line. at 5 P.M. got the whales to the ship.
at 6 commenced cutting at 9 finished one
whale. the N.W. fine. at 2 A.M. began
to blow and rain. Latter all hands took in
top sails. gave her two under close reefed
main top sail and main Spencer. at 5 1/2
commenced cutting the other whale very
rough sea wind S. at 10 finished cutting

clating away the whales. Latter part employed
dailing. commenced at 8 P.M.
