Begins with moderate breezes from the
S. Employed boiling. Saw 16 birds. The
mar in light. Boiling latter part calm.
Employed boiling. At noon Huaofo bearing E by E
Dist 20 miles. Lat 43-01

Remarks Friday Feb 22nd 605th
Begins with light airs and calm and a
heavy swell. Employed boiling.
Latter part calm. Lat 42-56

Remarks Saturday Feb 23rd 606th
Begins with light airs from S and calm.
Latter part moderate breezes from S. heading S.W.
Employed stowing oil. Toward 4 birds. Lat 42-46

Remarks Sunday Feb 24th 607th
Begins with pleasant breezes from S.W.
Latter part pleasant breezes from S.W. the mar in
light. Lat 42-54

Remarks Monday Feb 25th 608th
Begins with pleasant breezes from the south.
Latter part moderate breeze from S.W. by W. head to
the south saw a merchant bark. Lat 43-02

Remarks Tuesday Feb 26th 608th
Begins with moderate from S.W. by W. head to the S.
At 1 P.M. Huaofo bearing E by S Dist 30 miles.
Latter part strong breezes from the North. Saw 83
birds. At noon Huaofo bearing E by N Dist 30 miles.

Remarks Wednesday Feb 27th 611th
Begins with strong winds from N.W. and rainy. at 1 P.M.
hailed suddenly to the W.W. fair sails in sight.
Latter part strong winds and squally.

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Remarks Thursday Feb 28th 1867. 611
Begins with strong winds and squally from
N.W. at 1 P.M. Huaofo bearing E by N Dist
25 miles. Latter part strong southerly winds and a
rough sea.

Remarks Friday (P.M.) March 1st 612
Begins with strong winds from the south and
rough. Under double reefed main top sail and
fore sail and close reefed mizen. at 1 P.M. Huaofo bearing
E by N Dist 25 miles head to the westward.
Latter part more moderate. Lat 43-09

Remarks Saturday March 2nd 613th
Begins with fresh breezes from the south.
Latter part moderate breezes from the south.
At noon Huaofo bearing E by S Dist 25 miles
Lat 43-25

Remarks Sunday March 3rd 614
Begins with moderate breezes from the south
with fog squalls. Spoke the S.S. Colcaroe
Nantucket Capt. Mc Cleave. In morning 70 sperm.
Latter part fresh breezes from the N.W.
Lat 43-27

Remarks Monday March 4th 615th
Begins with from westward and squally.
Saw the Petrel Capt. Worth chasing a large
whale that they had fastened to and strangled.
Middle part to calm from S.W. under close reefed
main top sail and reefed fore sail. Latter part
moderate. Lat 43-25

Remarks Tuesday March 5th 616th
First part strong winds from S.W. under double
reef. at 2 P.M. winds began to head to the westward
Huaofo bearing E by N Dist 25 miles head to the S.W.
Latter part a calm from S.W. the Petrel in sight.
Lat 43-37
