Begins with a Gale from S.W. by W. have too
to the N.W. under close reefed Main Top Sail and
Fore Sail. Latter part Still a gale.

Remarks Thursday March 7th 1867
Begins with a Gale from S.W. But moderating.
Latter part Moderate.

Remarks Friday March 8th 1867
Begins with Moderate Breezes from S.W.
have been cutting gages Latter part light airs and
breezing. Lat 42-33

Remarks Saturday March 9th 1867
Begins with light airs from the S. Latter part
Moderate Breezes from the N.W. Staring S.E.
Lat 42-34

Remarks Sunday March 10th 1867
Begins with fresh Breezes from N.W. saw
three sails whaling. the Petrel got one. at 4.30
the wind hauled to the N in a Squall.
Latter part Moderate Breezes from S. Squall in light
Lat 43-11

Remarks Monday March 11th 1867
Begins with pleasant Breezes from S. saw the
Petrel to the leeward whaling. at 4 raised whales
coming quick to the windward. the S.B. Boat
struck and drew in. the Centist and S.B. Colored
in company. the Centist struck and lost his whale.
Latter part fine. saw 16 Boats and S.B. Fish.

Remarks Tuesday March 12th 1867
Begins with Moderate Breezes from S. three sails in
light. Middle and Latter parts Strong winds
from the N.W. and Bogg. under Close reef.

Remarks Wednesday March 13th 1867 624th
Begins with Strong winds from the W. and Bogg.
Under S.B. to under close reefed Fore and Mizzen
Top Sails and double reefed Main. One sail in light.
Latter part the same. Lat 42-11 Long 75-32

Remarks Thursday March 14th 1867 625th
Begins with Strong winds from W.S.W. and Bogg
Squalls. under close reefed Fore and Mizzen Top
Sails and double reefed Main. Latter part Strong
winds and Bogg Squalls. Lat 42-09 Long 75-27

Remarks Friday March 15th 1867 626th
Begins with Strong winds from W.S.W.
under Double reef. Latter part Moderate.
Land Dist 30 miles. Lat 42-00

Remarks Saturday March 16th 1867 627th
Begins with Moderate Breezes from S.W.
striking N.W. I have got to go into Port sooner
than I wished on account of some of the hands
having the scurvy. O my back is hard. I hope
God will favour me when he see's fit too. I have
oil. if I do not discover it. Latter part Moderate
Breezes from the North. repairing the S.B. Boat
got stove S.B. the whale that they half fastened
too. No Wh.

Remarks Sunday March 17th 1867 628th
Begins with Strong winds from the N.
and Squalls. Middle and Latter parts Strong
winds from W.S.W. and thick. hauled to the N.
under Double reefed Main Top Sail and Fore Sail.
No Wh.
