Remarks Thursday Nov 7th 1867. 863rd
 Begins with baffling winds from the N. E. & rain very much. Barometer 29.34 in.
 at 6 P.M. the vessel came out to the S. E. Ship
 kept close to the S. E. under close reefed main
 top sail and stern sails. Latter part - strong winds
 from N. W. saw a B.W. Lat 43-12 Long 80-28

Remarks Friday Nov 8th 864
 Begins with fresh Breeze from N. W. steering N. E. saw Chin
 B.W. Latter part fresh Breeze from the west. lowered
 for a right-whale. he showed no chance to get on to
 him. saw plenty Chin B.W. Lat 42-33 Long 76-34

Remarks Saturday Nov 9th. 865th
 Begins with strong winds from N. W. Latter part
 winds W and foggy. saw two right-whales
 going quick to the windward but could
 not catch them. No Ob

Remarks Sunday Nov 10th 866th
 Begins with moderate Breezes from N. W. and foggy.
 Latter part moderate with foggy squalls.
 Lat 44-41 Long 76-21

Remarks Monday Nov 11th 867th
 Begins with moderate Breezes from N. W.
 saw a right-whale. very shy. lowered for him
 twice, no use. saw another at sundown.
 Latter part fresh Breeze from N. W. saw a B.W.

Remarks Tuesday Nov 12th 868th
 Begins with moderate Breezes from N. W.
 Latter part moderate and fine. saw Chin B.W.
 Lat 41-13 Long 76-15

Remarks Wednesday Nov 13th 1867. 869th
 Begins with moderate Breezes from N. W. and fine. a
 heavy S.W. swell. saw 8 B.W. Fish caught one.
 Latter part calm. Bailing B.W. Fish. saw three
 right-whales. lowered. struck one with a poor
 chance. the whale under water. Drawed the Iron.
 Chased the other without success.
 Lat 41-45 Long 76-27

Remarks Thursday Nov 14th 1870th
 Begins with calm. B.W. Chasing right-whales
 could not get on. Latter part fresh Breeze from
 N. W. saw two right-whales lowered. struck
 one and drawed the Iron. At noon Chasing
 with the ship. Lat 41-47 Long 76-45

Remarks Friday Nov 15th 871st
 Begins with pleasant Breezes from N. W.
 at 1 P.M. lowered the B.W. for a right-
 whale. Latter part fresh Breezes and rugged.
 at 1 1/2 A.M. saw two right-whales. lowered
 the L.B. struck one and the Iron broke off last
 him. Lat 42-08 Long 77-13

Remarks Saturday Nov 16th 872nd
 Begins with fresh Breezes from N. W. and
 rugged. at 2 P.M. lowered for right-whale. the L.B.
 struck one with a slight chance and drawed.
 at 5 1/2 lowered for another. the L.B. struck. at 9 1/2
 took him to the ship. Latter part - strong winds
 at 5 A.M. commenced cutting at 10 finished.
 No Ob

Remarks Sunday Nov 17th 873rd
 Begins with strong winds from N. W. and rugged.
 under double reef. saw 9 right-whales. lowered
 no success. Latter part fresh Breezes and thick.
 saw three right-whales going quick to the
 N. W. Lat 42-28 Long 76-40

saw three right-whales at about 10 miles

saw two right-whales struck one and drawed the Iron
