Latter part light air from S.E. toward. Land 30 miles dist.
Lat 37-06

Remarks Tuesday Feb 25th 975th
Begins with light air from the N. Latter part
Moderate and baffling from N. to S.E. Lat 37-09.

Remarks Wednesday Feb 26th 976th
Begins with moderate Breeze from S.E. by S. at 3 P.M.
St. Mary's bearing N.E. by E by Compass Dist 35 miles
put away N.E. by N for Matahuana. at 5 P.M. came
to anchor at Matahuana in six fathoms water

Remarks Friday April 3rd 1868-1000th
Begins with fresh Breeze from S.W. at 1 P.M.
took the anchor and sailed from the Port
of Matahuana in a cruise toward Whaling.
Latter part fresh Breeze. The Marmotta in sight.
Lat 35-11 Long 76-44

Remarks Saturday April 4th 1011th
Begins with fresh Breeze from the S. Course W. by N.
Latter part moderate. at 10 1/2 A.M. made Juan Fernandez

Remarks Sunday April 5th 1012th
Begins with moderate Breeze from S.W. heading
by N. to the W. N.W. Juan bearing S.W. Dist 30 miles.
Latter part moderate. Lat 32-42 Long 80-04.

Begins with moderate Breeze from S.W. by W.
Latter part strong winds from W. Lat 33-12

Remarks Tuesday April 7th 1014th
Begins with strong winds from W. Latter part
Moderate. Lat 32-42 Long 80-13

Remarks Wednesday April 8th 1015th
Begins with light Breeze from S.E.
Latter part light air from S.W. Massafuro in
sight Dist 20 miles bearing S by E. Ident the Old Shore
Bop sail.

Remarks Thursday April 9th 1016th
Begins with light air from S.W.
Latter moderate from the W. repairing the Old Main. Bop
Sail. Massafuro in sight Dist 27 miles
Lat 32-56

Remarks Friday April 10th 1868-1017th
Begins with fresh Breeze from W. by N.
Latter part moderate gale from N.W. saw two whale
vessels. Lat 33-18

Remarks Saturday April 11th 1018th
Begins with a Gale from the S. at 6 hours
lost anchor. Close reefed main. Bop sail. Latter part
Moderate from S.E. Massafuro bearing S.E. Dist 30
miles. Lat 33-07 Long 82-09

Remarks Sunday April 12th 1019th
Moderate Spoke the Old Dark some by 5 P.M. saw
Whale 11 times in two hours. Lat 33-02 Long 82-09

Remarks Monday April 13th 1020th
Begins with moderate Breeze from S.E. three
whales in sight. Latter part light air from
N.W. Massafuro bearing S.E. Dist 30 miles
