Remarks Wednesday June 9th 1867 1439

At 1 1/2 P.M. took the Anchor with a light and baffling air. got as far ~~as~~ as Quiriquena and came to. the wind out to the N.W. so end wind North and raining

Remarks Thursday June 10th 1440

Fresh Breezes from S.W. at 2 1/2 A.M. took the Anchor and went to Sea bound home. at noon off the Beach. at 2 P.M. Long 73-25

Remarks Friday June 11th 1441

Fresh Breezes from the S.W. and increasing. at 4 1/2 A.M. reefed the Fore and Mizzen Top sails. Double reefed the Main and furlled jib & Main sails. Latter part a little more moderate. Barometer 30 1/10 Lat 36-26 Long 74-56

Remarks Saturday June 12th 1442

Begins with strong winds from the South heading to the W. S.W. under Double reef. Latter part strong winds. Employed rearing running rigging. Barometer 30 1/10 Lat 36-32 Long 76-34

Remarks Sunday June 13th 1443

Begins with strong winds from S.W. heading by to the W. Latter part more moderate. Barometer 30 1/10 Lat 36-28 Long 78-06

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Remarks Monday June 14th 1867 1444

Begins with fresh Breezes with Prog Squal from the South. heading by to the Westward. Latter part moderate and baffling. at 11 A.M. took a Breeze from the W. Course S. Lat 36-06 Long 78-57

Remarks Tuesday June 15th 1445

Begins with fresh Breezes from W. by S. Course S. Bent a new Fore and Main Sail, and new Main Top Sails. Middle part strong winds from W. S.W. and Squal. Latter part blew on to a Gale at 10 A.M. took in the Fore sail Fore and Mizzen Top Sails wind S.W. at 11 A.M. wore ship to the Westward. Barometer 29 3/10 Thermometer 50. Lat 37-50 Long 79-15

Remarks Wednesday June 16th 1446

Begins with a strong Gale from S.W. with very heavy squalls. Dying too under close reefed Main Top sail and reefed Fore sail. Head to the Westward. Barometer 29 3/10. Latter part moderate with a heavy swell. Barometer 30 1/10 Lat 37-26 Long 79-23

Remarks Thursday June 17th 1447

Begins with moderate Breezes from S.W. and heavy swell. Barometer 30 1/10 heading by to the Southward. Latter part strong winds from S.W. under Double Reef. Barometer 30 1/10 Lat 38-46

Remarks Friday June 18th 1448

Begins with strong winds from W. S.W. heading S. at 3 P.M. wind hauled to the S and drew on a gale took in all but close reefed Main Top sail and have too head to the Westward. Barometer 30. Latter part wind S.W. wore ship to the S.W. Lat 38-52
