Remarks Saturday June 19th 1869 1459
Begins with a fresh Gale from the west-
ward to the S. Under close reefed Main Top
Sail and reefed Fore Sail. Boats up and
83 Boats. Barometer 30³. Latter part fresh
Gale from the W. to with heavy squalls. Under
close reefed Top Sails and reefed courses. heading
South. Barometer 29⁷/₁₀. No Ch.

Remarks Sunday June 20th 1450
Begins with fresh Gale from W. S. W. and
increasing. Ship under close reefed Top Sails and
reefed courses. at 2 P.M. took in the Main Sail
and Mizen Top Sail. at 6 took in the Fore Sail
Top Sail. Barometer 29⁷/₁₀. heavy squalls of rain
Ship heading from S to S.W. Middle part a heavy
Gale S.W. at 11 P.M. took in the Fore Sail.
Latter part little more moderate. Set the Fore Sail
Lat 40-35 Long 78-35

Remarks Monday June 21st 1451
Begins with a fresh Gale from S.W. Ship
under close reefed Fore & Main Top Sails
and reefed Fore Sail. heading S.W.
Barometer 30³. Middle part a Gale from S.W.
at 12 took in Fore Top Sail and Fore Sail. Barometer
29⁷/₁₀. Latter part more moderate. at 8 P.M. were
Ship to the westward. Set Fore Sail and Fore
Top Sails. Barometer rising. Lat 41-03 Long 78-15

Remarks Tuesday June 22nd 1452
Begins with fresh Gale from S.W. But
moderating. a heavy swell from S.W. heading
to the westward. Barometer 30⁷/₁₀. Under close
reefed Top Sails and reefed courses. at 10 P.M. wind hauled to
the S.W. were Ship to the S.W. Latter part wind W by
S. Course S by W. at 11 Double Reefed. Barometer falling
Lat 41-42 Long 78-38

Remarks Wednesday June 23rd 1453
Begins with strong winds from N. by N. and
S.W. with a heavy southerly sea. Steering
S by N under Double reefed Top Sails and courses.
at 4 P.M. wind hauled to the S.W. in a squall.
Close reefed the Top Sails furlled the Main Sail
and fidd. Barometer 30³ at 12 wind hauled
to the S.W. were Ship to the westward.
Latter part more moderate under Double Reefed
and reefed Main Sail. Barometer 30⁷/₁₀ Thermometer
48³ Lat 42-12 Long 79-37

Remarks Thursday June 24th 1454
Begins with strong winds from S.W.
heading to the westward under Double Reef.
at 6 P.M. the wind S. Barometer 30⁷/₁₀. Latter part
light air from the S and a heavy swell from the
S.W. with foggy squalls. Barometer 30³/₁₀ Thermometer 50³
Lat 41-47 Long 80-16

Remarks Friday June 25th 1455
Begins with light air from the South with
foggy squalls. Barometer 30⁷/₁₀. Latter part light
breezes from S.W. by W. heading by to the S.W.
Thermometer 48³ Lat 42-06 Long 80-04

Remarks Saturday June 26th 1456
Begins with moderate breeze from S.W. with
foggy squalls. at 4 P.M. hauled to S.W. when
shall we get a wind to get to the South
Barometer 30⁷/₁₀ Middle part moderate breeze
from the S. at 1 P.M. were Ship to the
westward. Latter part wind S.E. by E
heading by to the Southward.
Thermometer 48³ Lat 43-05 Long 80-44
