Remarks Thursday July 15th 1879. 1475
Begins with fine breeze from S by W.
Course N by E all crewing sail set. Barometer
29.75 and rising slowly. Thermometer 55°

Middle part - Moderate breeze from the S. and
squally. at 1 P.M. wind hauled to the S.W. Latter
part strong winds from S.W. with heavy squalls
of wind and rain. Steering N by E under double
reef fore and main top sails. Whole main and
main top gall sail and fore sail. Barometer 30
Thermometer 57° Lat 37-54 Long 46-33

Remarks Friday July 16th 1879
Begins with strong gale from S.W. and heavy
squalls. at 3 P.M. took in the main top gall sail.
Course N.E. Barometer 30.75. Thermometer 57
Latter part - Moderate from the S. Barometer 30.25
Thermometer 47° Lat 36-16 Long 44-26

Remarks Saturday July 17th 1879
Begins with squally weather wind from
S by S.W. with hail squalls. at 4 P.M. took
in the top gall sails and by 5 P.M.
Barometer 30.25. Thermometer 47° Latter part -
pleasant breeze between squalls from S.W.
Course N.E. by E. Barometer 30.75 Thermometer 48
Lat 34-54 Long 42-15

Remarks Sunday July 18th 1879
Begins with moderate breeze from
S by W. Course N.E. by E. Squalls occasionally.
all sail set. Barometer 30.75 Thermometer 50
Middle part strong winds. Latter part strong
winds and squally. Course N.E. Saw a large
ship steering about N. Barometer 30.75
Thermometer 47° Lat 32-53 Long 38-05

Remarks Monday July 19th 1879. 1479
Begins with a moderate gale from S by W
course N.E. by N under whole top gall and
main top gall sail. Latter part strong winds
from the S. and squally. Barometer 30.75 Lat
Barometer 52° Lat 30-00 Long 37-15

Remarks Tuesday July 20th 1880
Begins with strong winds from the south
course N.E. by N. at 6 P.M. wind hauled to
the S.E. Barometer 30.75 Thermometer 52°
Latter part - Moderate breeze from E by S. heading
by to the N.E. by N. Barometer 30.75 Thermometer 60
Lat 27-35 Long 35-57

Remarks Wednesday July 21st 1881
Begins with pleasant breeze from E by S
heading by the wind N.E. by N. Barometer 30.75
Thermometer 60 Latter part - fresh breeze and
drizzling from E by S to E.N.E. heading by to N.
the Northward. Thermometer 62 Barometer 30.75
to rip some of the Deck Sheathing.
Lat 25-04 Long 35-29

Remarks Thursday July 22nd 1882
Begins with strong winds from E to E.N.E.
and squally. heading by to the Northward.
at 6 P.M. took in the fore and main top
gall sails. Latter part moderate breeze
from N.E. by E. heading by to the S.
Lat 22-33 Long 35-32

Remarks Friday July 23rd 1883
Begins with moderate breeze from N.E. heading
by to the N.W. Saw two sails heading to the S.
Latter part - light breeze from N.E. head
to the N.W. Saw two sail heading to
the South. Lat 21-40 Long 36-32
