

Remarks on Board Bk Globe
 Tues. March 9th 1869

First part commences strong breeze from the N.W. ends with a light gale took in the main top-gallant-sail & double reefed main top-sail put new straps on the crane. Mid part squally carried double reefed top-sail & courses during the night. Latter part wind light & baffling. Stood my watch last night 2nd Mate has been sick but has recovered last night. Boatswain was taken sick did not stand any watch last night. Watch employed in breaking out main hatch for turnips potatoes & to clear up things in some shape. made all sail saw 2 vessels.

Wednes. March 10th

This day begin with a light breeze from the N. heading E. made rove the falls to the Mast & Starboard Bow Boats expect to rig them out on the crane tomorrow. They are on the try works at present. stowed the turnips & potatoes back in the main hold between decks. Mr Penney & Mr Kenney heading the watches. Mid part fresh breeze from the S.E. steering by the wind on the Starboard tack. Latter part strong breeze from the S.E. steering the same employed in covering the hoops for the midst heads cooper employed in making a vice bench. Brick the Boat-stewer no better.

 Thursday March 11th

This day commenced with a strong breeze from the S.E. steering by the wind under all sail except the Spent left top-sail & fly-ing jib cooper employed in making a vice bench watch employed in ship's duty. Mr Eggshall heads the Starboard watch. Mid part blowing strong from the S.E. steering by the wind on the Starboard tack at 1 1/2 o'clock double reefed the top-sail shortly after the pin of which the main tack was made fast too. parted. hauled the main sail up & set it shortly after set 3 1/2 o'clock took in the courses and fore top-sail also close reefed the main top-sail set the main Spencer. Latter part blowing a gale from the S.E. set the fore-sail close reefed the fore top-sail & set it.

7th day

Friday March 12th 1869

This day commenced with a gale from the S.E. heading by the wind under the same sail. set up the main top-mast & top-gallant & royal back stays. Mid part blowing a gale from the S.W. Latter part blowing a gale from the S.W. steering by the wind set a reef out of the top-sail. saw an English Bark heading to the N.E.

8th day

Sat. March 13th 1869

First part commences breezing reefed the top-sails again (daisy) at 9 o'clock set the reef out of each top-sail moderating some & weather looking rather better. Brice the Boat-stewer has recovered. Mid part moderating
