

Continued Remarks On Board

33rd day

Wednesday April 7th

This day commences with a light breeze from the N.E. steering S.P.E. under all sail that will draw. at 4 o'clock took the old Starboard Boat off of the cranes & put her on the chock. Same time put out the new one & partly-rigged her. saw porpoises. Mid part light air from the N.E. steering S. under all sail. Latter part light breeze from the N.E. steering South under all sail saw 3 sails set up the lower fore rigging & top-mast backstays

34th

Thursday April 8th

First part the same 4 sails in sight signified an American Bark to the leeward employed in diving off the fore rigging & rigging Starboard Boat. saw cowfish & black fish wind light from the S.E. I ~~think~~ believe that our Boat is all fitted for Whaling now. I hope we shall be able to catch some Whales before long. I hope that I shall have better luck on my side than I did last voyage. Mid part fresh breeze from the N.E. steering South. took in the fore top-gallant sail fly ing jib gall-top sail & spanker. Latter part fine breeze from the N.E. steering the same nothing in sight cooper employed in ballening the water ways in the waist & one King Scotsman broke out cloth for Boat sails & cut them saw 1 sail

N.B. Globe April 9th 1867

35th

Friday April 9th 1867

First part the same all sail out employed in making Boat sail & capping. at 6 o'clock shortened sail to double reefed top-sail course jib & spanker. set the watches different divided them into 3 watches. I don't think that I like these watches a bit but have got to put up with it. at 6 1/2 o'clock hove too on the Port tack heading S.P.E. Mid part fresh breeze from the N.E. heading by the wind under the same sail. Latter part fresh breeze from the N.E. steering by the wind on the Port tack shook the reef out of the top sail & set the fly ing jib employed in making Boat sail called all hands at 5 o'clock saw 1 sail

36th

Sat. April 10th

First part the same saw 1 sail employed in making Boat sail at sundown shortened sail to double reefed top sails fore sail jib & spanker raised a small white water proved to be nothing. Mid part heading by the wind under double reefed top sail fore sail jib & spanker. Latter part fine steady breeze from the N.E. steering W.S.W. under top sail fore sail jib & spanker 2 sails in sight broke out water mottases rice made new line tack racks for the Quarter Boat called all hands at 5 o'clock don't like these watches a bit
