

On Board Bk Globe Cruising

47th day

Wednesday April 21st

First part - the same. painted the
Waist & L airboard Boats line covers. cut
out a draw water bucket. Capt'n at
work on it. covered a spare set of
rollocks. broke out a keg of syrup
for table use. made a keg for the
same. made a another molasses
keg. nothing seen. Mid part heading
N. Latter part - fresh breeze from the
E & E wore ship at 8.0 clock heading
S. E. set main sail & jib. saw 12 all
employed in making leather bucket - to
draw water with. & picking over rasins
cooper made a tea bucket.

48th day

Thursday April 22nd

First part the same took the shives
out of the Bow Boats davit in order to
clean them. employed in picking over
raisins. saw 1 sail. at sundown shortened
sail as usual. Mid part - fresh breeze
heading by the wind on the Port tack.
Latter part - fresh breeze heading S. E. set
the reef out of the main top sail & one
reef out of the fore topsail & set main sail
& jib. at 7.0 clock wore ship heading
N. by the wind. caught 2. porpoises
took the shives out of the Bow Boats
after davit and over hauled the Block
Capt'n employed in making the bucket
the crew employed in picking over
raisins nothing seen



49th day

Friday April 23rd 1869

First part - fine weather - breeze fresh
from the E & E heading by the wind
under the same sail. saw nothing
employed in ships duty. at sundown
shortened sail to double reefed top sail
fore sail & stay sail. Mid part the same
Latter part - fresh breeze from the E & E
steaming by the wind on the Starboard
tack. set the reef out the top sails
& set main sail & jib. at 7.0 clock
raised a school of Blackfish. lowered
all the Boat & gave cheer until half
past 8. and then came aboard with
great success did not see them after
lowering. employed in ships duty

50th day

Sat April 24th

First part - light breeze at
12.0 clock wore ship heading S. W
by the wind. set flying jib & main
top - gallant sail. nothing seen. at
sundown took in the light sail double
reefed & furled the jib & main sail
steaming by the wind on the Port tack.
Mid part the same Latter part - fine
breeze from the N & E steaming full & by
set the reef out & set the main sail
& jib. wore ship at 7.0 clock. nothing
in sight broke out water.

51st day

Sun April 25th

First part the same. employed in
ships duty. saw 2. sail. at 6.0 clock
spoke and gunned the Sch'r L. V. Smith
of Boston 13 months out with 160. sperm
was bound to Barbadoes soon. at sundown shortened
sail as usual. Mid part the same.
