

On Board Bk Globe Sailed

Mon May 10th 1868

This day commences with a light breeze from the S.E. Steaming N. & E. under all sail. Nothing seen. Mid part the same. Latter part moderate breeze from the S.E. Steaming N. & E. under all sail. Broke out all the Bread & Flour between decks to Cooper at 1. Sail in sight and finbacks. Very warm here at present don't think that I ever experienced much warmer climate. Lat 27. 02. Long 49. 31.

Tues May 11th 1868

This day commences with a very light breeze from the S.E. Steaming the same. Slowed off the hold finbacks in sight and 1 sail. Mid part the same. Latter part fine breeze from the S. Steaming N. 1 sail in sight. Last night at sundown took in flying jib & gaff top sail fore top g. sail & main sail at 10 1/2 o'clock raised a large white water to the windward immediately luffed to the wind on the Starboard & set main sail & flying jib. stood along by the wind about an hour did not see any thing more of the white water therefore kept off on the old course.

Wednes May 12th

First part the same. nothing seen at sundown double reefed & took in the light sails & furled the main sail. luffed to the wind on the Starboard. Mid part the same. Latter part the same. Steaming N. & E. under all sail. Broke out all the Bread & Flour between decks to Cooper at 1. Sail in sight and finbacks. Very warm here at present don't think that I ever experienced much warmer climate. Lat 27. 02. Long 49. 31.

March 6th for the Atlantic Ocean

Thursday May 13th

This day commences with a fresh breeze from the N.E. Steaming by the wind under hold top sail course jib & spanker. Nothing seen at sundown double reefed the top sails & furled the jib & main sail. On the Starboard tack. Mid part the same. Latter part fresh breeze from the S.E. Steaming N. & W. under all sail but fore top gallant sail. Broke out water rice & molasses filled 2 large casks in the main hold with salt water. Capt. employed in making blocks for the royal knuckle Cooper filled the forecast to the scuttle butt.

Friday May 14th

First part light breeze from the S.E. Steaming the same. at 3 o'clock got in rain. took in the light sails double reefed & furled jib & main sail & luffed to the wind on the Starboard tack. (sea for supper made out of salt water). Mid part the same. at 12 o'clock. Latter part fresh breeze from the S.E. at day light made all sail except fore top gallant sail & kept off to the S.W. at 6 o'clock raised a large school of sperm whales to the windward immediately luffed to the wind & lowered the Larboard Mast & Bow Boat and gave chase shortly after the Starboard Boat lowered for whale to the leeward of the ship and struck a small one but -
