

Continued Remarks

The iron of the whale at 9 1/2 o'clock all came aboard the whale going quick to the windward after Breakfast there were nothing in sight.

71st

Sat May 15th 1868

This day commenced with a fresh breeze from the E. heaving up for the whales. Tacked 3 or 4 times during the afternoon at 6 1/2 o'clock raised other whales to the leeward. supposed to be sperm whales but might be long spind did not lower. At sundown double reefed & took in the light sail steering by the wind on the Port tack heading S. E. Next part - the same wore ship at 12 o'clock. Latter part - light breeze from the S. E. steering by the wind on the Port tack saw fin backs. broke out Reef. made full sail

72nd

Sun. May 16th

First part the same tacked ship made & put on a scotch man to the Mizzen top mast stay nothing in sight - at sundown took in the light sail & double reefed also furlled the main sail. Next part - the same wore ship at 2 o'clock. Latter part - rained at 5 o'clock set the reef & set the jib & main sail steering by the wind on the Starboard tack nothing in sight wind light from the S. E. at 8 1/2 set in thick & rainy double reefed & hauled up the main sail at 10 o'clock cleared up some. set the main sail steering the same

B. & G. Globe off New Bedford

73rd day

Mon May 17th

This day commenced with a light breeze from the S. E. steering the same set the reef out. at sundown double reefed the top sails & furlled the light sail also furlled the main sail. Next part had a rain squall. breeze very light wore around at 2 o'clock saw cowfish. Latter part - made all sail except fore-top & allant sail. took a light breeze from the N. W. steering by the wind on the Port tack nothing in sight. at 10 1/2 o'clock died away to a calm. employed in making sail bags & c. employed the cask of Flour washed out the cask & stowed it below

74th

Tues May 18th

First part - the same. nothing in sight - bent the main top - gallant sail over crew. at sundown double reefed & took in the light sails & furlled the main sail. Next part - calm. Latter part - light breeze from the N. W. steering by the wind. made all sail except fore-top-gallant sail. saw Shearwaters. and 1 sail. made new main ropes forward & overhauled the Larboard Boat tackle.

75th

Wednes May 19th

This day commenced with a light breeze from the N. W. steering by the wind on the same tack (Port tack). saw 3 sails one of them a Whaling Bark. at sundown bits in sail as usual. Next part - light breeze with rain squalls. Latter part - very light breeze from the N. W. (water in sight - is the leeward ^{overhauled the water} to the Boat ^{saw porpoise} very
