

Bk Globe Cruising for Sperm

76th

Thursday May 20th

This day begins with a light breeze from the S.W. made all sail except fore top gallant sail steaming by the wind on the Port tack. signalled this Bark to the leeward but could not make her out. at 4 o'clock spoke the said vessel and found her to be the Cicero Capt. Dunn of New Bedford saw Whales here last Saturday. Capt. went aboard (fine weather). at sundown shortened sail as usual. No wind past nearly calm. boat came aboard at 9 o'clock. Latter part fine breeze from the S.W. at daylight made all sail but the fore top g. sail steaming by the wind on the Port tack. The Cicero in sight on the same tack also saw another sail

77th day

Friday May 21st

This day commences with a moderate breeze from the S.W. at 12 o'clock packed ship steaming by the wind 4 sail in sight at sundown took in the light sail & hauled up the main sail. the Cicero in sight off the leeward. No wind past light breeze from the S.W. steaming by the wind on the Port tack packed ship at 12 o'clock. Latter part light breeze from the S.W. made all sail but fore top g. sail. heading to the N.W. 4 sail in sight. the Bark Cicero to the leeward.

78th

Whale Bk Globe May 1861

Sat May 22nd

This day commences with a light breeze from the S.W. heading to the N.W. under the same sail. 3 sail in sight. water employed in salting & picking up. at 5 o'clock spoke the Cicero. Capt. came aboard. exchanged a Boat load of wood for the said Bark potato. pen also gave her a keg of tar at sundown shortened sail to double reefed top sail, jib & spanker. No wind past. the same commencing at 11 o'clock parted from the said Bark after coming aboard hauled forward on the Starboard tack. Latter part light breeze from the S.E. steaming to the N.W. made all sail but fore top g. sail broke out the fore hold & stowed the potato pen away also broke out fore saw grasses & 3 sails Cicero in sight to the leeward

79th

Sun May 23rd

First part the same 2 sail in sight. at sundown double reefed the top sail. furled the light sail & main sail. jib & spanker. No wind past the same. Latter part moderate breeze from the S.E. steaming by the wind on the Starboard tack made sail as usual. (nothing seen). no day no Sunday with me on board the Globe. It could I be where my thought have been directed at time during this day. But one thinks never mind for the whole of time are ever busy & soon the time will roll around found to be there
