

Continued Remarks Cruising

745th

Wednesday July 28th

This day commences with a light breeze from the N & E. Steering to the S & W under all sail. 1 Bark in sight to the windward supposed to be the Bk. Orray Galt. At sundown look in the light sails & double reefed the topsails. At 11 part light breeze from the N & E steered South until 12 o'clock & then luffed to the wind on the Port tack.

Latter part light breeze from the N & E. Steering to the Southward under all sail. 6 sails in sight spoke the th M^{rs} Wallston (Frenchman) from Buenos Ayres. exchanged Longitudes with her. The Bk. Orray Galt in sight to the windward this morning.

Charles Huesgrave came aft and stated to the Captⁿ before the ship company that he was one of the party concerned in the fire scrape. he said that he had been undertaking the same job for a boat 15 days & said that White had been teasing him for some time to assist him in the act and finally consented to do so he said that he helped him pick the oakum for the same. & also helped him to take the hatch off in order to enter the fore hold. therefore he has turned State Evidence. he also said that he had heard White threaten to enter the Cabin some night when the Captⁿ was asleep and take his life. Charles Huesgrave also says he under took to pay a board off of the sail pen in order to set the ship on fire in this way but failed to do so. the boats were away from the ship at the time

Western Ground

This morning his chest was thoroughly searched as we have heard of his carrying a drug - shop.

Stowed down the 2 casks of oil in the main lower hold stowed down about 8 bbls broke out flour

White tries to bring some of the rest of the crew into the scrape but cannot come it. I think he deserves a severe chastising which he most likely will get.

746th

Thursday July 29th

This day commences with a light breeze from the N & E steering to the S & W under all sail. Bk. O. Galt in sight to the windward saw several sails all merchantmen at sundown shortened sail as usual. at 6 o'clock spoke and gammoned the Orray Galt. Had part the same. at 11 o'clock hauled from the said vessel. Latter part fine breeze from the N & E. steering by the wind on the Port tack under all sail. Orray Galt & 3 merchantmen in sight. saw porpoise signalled a Norwegian Brig.

747th

Friday July 30th

This day commences with light breeze from the N & E. steering to the N & W under all sail. Orray Galt in sight and 2 other sails. at sundown look in the light sails & double reefed & hauled up the main sail. & luffed to the wind on the Starboard tack.

White says that know one knows how much he suffers. he is in a miserable condition. Had part the same. Latter part light breeze from the E & S. steering to the N & W under all sail on the Starboard broke out water meat & beans. Saw 3 sails. Orray Galt in sight.
