

On Board B^e Globe

154th day

Friday Aug 6th 1869

This day begins with a light breeze from the S.E. steering by the wind under all sail except fore-top-gallant-sail. employed in making baskets and overhauling & shaping blocks & sail in sight. Saw a school of grampuses after 4 o'clock washed out the Sturgeon it is the 2nd time that it has been washed since we left New Bedford it was washed by the Bealston at sundown. The same. Mid part steering by the wind under all sail on the Starboard tack with a light breeze from the S.E. Latter part light breeze from the S.E. heading N.E. by the wind under all sail on the Starboard tack. broke out water. Jan. 2. Sails at 7 1/2 o'clock. Spoke the B^e Sea Fox Capt. Laro of New Bedford. Well port. 25 months out with 730. sperm. She is right from Fozal. got some potatoes & onions from her.

Sat. Aug 7th 1869

This day commences with a fresh breeze from the S.E. heading the same. Nothing in sight at sundown tacked ship heading S. by E. look in the light sail. Mid part steering by the wind on the Port tack. Latter part fresh breeze with rain squalls from the S.E. steering by the wind on the Starboard tack. tacked ship at 6 o'clock. look in light sail. set them this morning.

156th day

Sun. Aug 8th 1869

This day commences with a fresh breeze from the S.E. steering the same. at sundown tacked ship heading S.E. by E. by the wind broke out water. & died at sundown. Mid part strong breeze from the S.E. tacked at 12 o'clock heading S. by E. Latter part the same tacked at 1 o'clock under all sail.

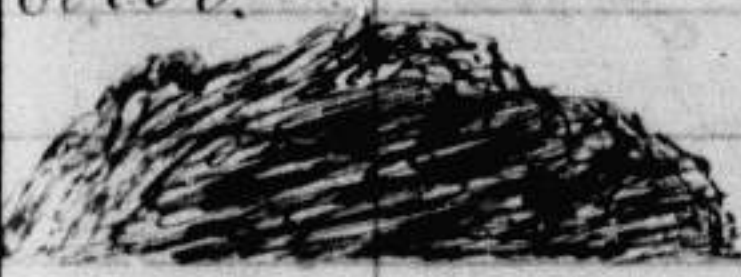
Off Flores. Western Islands 1869

157th day

Mon Aug 9th 1869

This day commences with a fresh breeze from the S.E. steering by the wind on the Starboard tack under all sail except fore-top-gallant-sail. Nothing in sight at sundown tacked ship heading South by the wind. Mid part strong breeze from the East. heading by the wind on the Port tack at 9 1/2 o'clock look in the light sail. Latter part fresh breeze from the S.E. steering by the wind on the Port tack under all sail. raised Flores & Corvo bearing S.E. about 28 miles distant.

158th day

Tues. Aug 10th 1869

This day commences with a fresh breeze from the S.E. heading S.E. under all sail but fore-top-gallant-sail. Saw grampuses. Mid part steering by the wind tacked at 10 o'clock. breeze very light from the S.E. Latter part fresh breeze from the S.E. steering by the wind on the Port tack. Land about 20 miles distant at 10 o'clock spoke & anchored the Bark Mercury of New Bedford Capt. Ripley 2 1/2 months out with 60 lbs sperm. The Capt. has his wife & child aboard. Soon the Bealston received a letter by this vessel. employed in putting up the potato gun.
