

Off Shore On Board Bk Globe

763rd

Sun Aug 15th 1868

This day commences with a fresh breeze from the S. working up for Santa Cruz. at 4 1/2 o'clock a boat came from shore. The Capt. sent the Boat to bring the D. Council aboard as he wished to transact some business with him. at sundown the Boat returned to the shore. I find that there is not any letter here for the ship and I am very much disappointed for I certainly expected some. lowered the Mast Boat to find send letters to Hoyal by the packet that was bound there. I sent 6 letters by this vessel home. Mid part laying off & on at Santa Cruz under all sail with a light breeze from the S. laying off & on. Latter part light breeze from the S. W. laying off & on under all sail

Mon Aug 16th 1868

This day commences with a light breeze from the S. W. laying off & on at Santa Cruz under all sail at 12 1/2 o'clock a boat came from shore and took the Capt. ashore at 5 o'clock. Boat came off and brought 30 bushels of potatoes & 2 small pigs & a sow. also water melons & about 20 dozen of eggs. White was let out of irons & went ashore in this Boat. (Capt. ashore.) 3 sails in sight. Boat came off at sundown. stating the Capt. was not coming off. Mid part laying off & on. Latter part light breeze from the S. laying off & on under all sail Capt. came off at 9 o'clock. 7 sails in sight

Off Shore Western Islands

Tue Aug 17th 1868

This day commences with a light breeze from the South. working up to the South Point of Glouce. Broke out 3 Boxes of Tobacco for sale & 2 sails in sight. 1 Whaling Bark and a schooner laying off & on at Ponta-del-guanda. Mid part light breeze from the Southward laying off & on (Large). Latter part light breeze from the S. 4 Whaling Barks & a schooner in sight all laying off & on for recruits. Dec at 9 o'clock Capt. took White & a Boat crew & went aboard of the Oray East & Bk. Louisa from their vessel went aboard of the Bk. Marcella & Bk. Spartan & from the last vessel went ashore at Ponta-del-guanda where White deserted.

Wednes Aug 18th 1868

This day commences with a calm broke out. Glaze & water and put 2 buckets into 2 buckets 12 sails in sight at sundown Boat returned aboard leaving the Capt. ashore. The Boat brought off 3 men to join the ship. sent 2 of the men ashore that came aboard at Lijohn the Bk. Louisa has taken 31 Bk. sperm. I received news of the death of my Brother-in-law (Joseph D. afford) also received news of my sister-in-law. Mid part calm. Latter part light air. Bk. Marcella & Spartan off and on at this place also schooner Louisa A. Boat went in this morning & brought of the Capt. the mate & myself went aboard of the Marcella sent in a rest of cargo for water. Bk. Louis (Frenchman) off & on here.
