

173rd day

Continued Remarks On board B.R.
Wednesday Aug 25th

This day commences with a calm. Nothing in sight. Mid part nearly calm. Latter part calm. Nothing seen.

174th

Thursday Aug 26th

This day commences with a light breeze from the S.W. heading to the Eastward under all sail. Nothing in sight. Broke out paint & mixed it up to paint the Boats. Mid part calm. Latter part the same. Turned up the Port Boats & painted them green with a white streak.

175th

Friday Aug 27th

This day commences with a calm & sails in sight. Saw (grampuses) at sundown. Turned the Boats over. Broke out meal & bread. Mid part light breeze from the S.W. Latter part light breeze from the S.W. steering by the wind under all sail & sails in sight. Turned over the Starboard Boats & painted them also painted the overhead Boats.

176th

Sat Aug 28th 1868

This day commences the same. Saw porpoises and 3 sails. Turned the Bow Boat back & painted key & buckets &c. Mid part light breeze from the S.W. steering by the wind under all sail on the Starboard tack. Latter part fresh breeze from the S.W. steering by the wind. Broke out molasses & meal. Saw grampuses picked up 80 gallons of Petroleum oil.

177th day

Sun Aug 29th 1868

This day commences with a fresh breeze from the S.W. steering by E. under all sail. Mid part squally with rain. This in the high tide and set him again. Latter part steering South with a light breeze from the S.W.

178th

Mon Aug 30th 1868

This day commences with a light breeze from the S.W. steering South under all sail. Nothing in sight. At sundown the same. Mid part light breeze from the S.W. steering South under all sail. Latter part light breeze from the S.W. steering to the S. under all sail. Nothing in sight. Lowered the Starboard Boat for the purpose of fishing along side of a bit of water. but came off with fishermen's luck. Overhauled the main spinnaker block &c. rose main ballast to Spencer.

179th 1868

Tue Aug 31st 1868

This day commences with a light breeze from the S.W. steering to the South under all sail. Saw grampuses &c. rose. saw main top gallant ballast. Corn sold a new pair of shoes for 1 dollar in currency. Mid part the same. Latter part light breeze from the S.W. steering to the W. under all sail. On the Port tack. washed the fore side of the ship & painted it. Filled 6 casks of water and put them on the Starboard side in order to heel the ship to paint.

180th

Wednesday Sept 1st

This day commences with a fresh breeze from the S.W. steering by the wind under all sail on the Port tack. Finished painting on the Port side at 2 o'clock. Nothing seen. Mid part light breeze from the S.W. steering by the wind under all sail on the Port tack. Latter part light breeze from the S.W. steering by the wind under all sail on the Port tack. Nothing in sight. Put up main top of rigging employed in making demersal.
