

Bk. Globe At Annabona

219th

Sat. Oct. 9th 1865

This day commences with a moderate breeze from the S.W. sent the raft ashore the waist & Bow. Boat takes the raft ashore at 5 1/2 o'clock got the raft along side at sundown had the raft all on on deck amounting to 18 casks. Saw hump Backs around the ship here today. I don't think that I ever saw or heard of such a miserable hole as this in my life. It is just fine weather. Captain & Officer heading the watches. Latter part light breeze from the S.W. stowed down the water & sent the raft ashore to fill washed off the ship outside saw hump Backs.

220th

Sun. Oct. 10th 1865

This day commences with a light air got the raft along side at 1 1/2 o'clock run some of casks of water below and sent a small raft ashore at 4 1/2 o'clock had the raft along side at 5 had it on on deck. Saw hump Backs. Mid part fine weather. Latter part the same. Saw hump Backs painted the bende on the Port side washed off deck this morning. Starboard watch ashore broke out Corn.

221st

Mon. Oct. 11th

This day commences with a light breeze from the S.W. had a guinea hen stew for dinner also had some fresh fish for supper at sundown sent 2 Boats in after the watch all hands came off except Robert Scott & John C. Coon (Boatsteerer) it is supposed that they have deserted saw hump Backs & did part the same.

On Board Bk. Globe at Annabona

222nd

Tue. Oct. 12th

This day commences with a light breeze from the S.W. employed in stowing down the water. Starboard watch ashore on Liberty. Saw hump Backs finished stowing down the water at 8 1/2 o'clock. Saw hump Backs heading in for the land. Lowered 2 Boats for hump back that came near the ship but caught them out. I saw Oct. 12th 1865

This day commences the same watch ashore. Lowered the Waist & Starboard Boats for hump Backs but could not strike any of them at sundown Boat went in for the watch all came aboard but Wm. Lane Andrew B. Chase & Chas. Guidard it is supposed they have deserted. I have been ashore today and of all the meanest holes this beats all. There is nothing but hills Rocks Woods & Viggers etc. It is just fine weather. Latter part fresh breeze from the S.W. employed in stowing wood brought off 3 Boat loads & stowed it away. Traded off 2 Back fish meat for Bananas lime Potatoes peppers &c. Saw hump Backs sent down the fore yard in order to screw the brass bands taught. sent it aloft again & bent the dail.

Wed. Oct. 13

This day commences with a fresh breeze from the S.W. stowed 3 Boat loads of wood. Still part the same. Latter part light breeze at 7 o'clock the 3 Boats Starboard Waist & Bow Boats left the ship in pursuit of hump Backs saw 3 or 4 but could not get on to them pulled around the Island and came to ship at 12 o'clock.

223rd

4 1/2 Boat loads of wood and stowed it in the hold.
