

Remarks on Board Bk. Globe at Annabon

224th

Thursday Oct. 14th

This day commences with a light breeze from the Land Westward. At 1-2 1/2 o'clock lowered the Waist & Bow Boats for a hump Back but could not get on to him. Washed off deck & traded off the remainder of the fish meat for potatoes and other stuff. The Captain Mate 2nd Mate & 4th Mate went ashore after the deserted men Coon Leane & Scott was all ready to come aboard as the natives had refused them and things to eat. They were very hungry. They were put in irons on the back after they came aboard they were put in the Club room for lodging at sundown the Captain 2nd Mate and 4th Mate went ashore in search of Chase & Guineard. Wind part fine weather at 7 1/2 o'clock the Captain and Officers returned to the ship with Chase & Guineard in irons they were in a starving condition when captured. They were left on deck to sleep the night. Latter part light breeze from the S.W. at 6 o'clock got the Larboard anchor on the Bow & lashed. At 7 o'clock took the anchor and stood out to sea under all sail farewell to Annabon. employed on stowing anchor & chains. Coon Leane Scott and Chase was let out of irons and sent on duty. Coon is sent forward to act as fore mast hand. The Captain has taken some money for which he has been selling his clothes & food and says he cannot have again until his bill is paid. got about 200 bunches of Bananas at Annabon and about 5 bushels of Sweet potatoes. examined the mast heads nothing in sight.

From Annabon to Enore 1869

Friday Oct. 15th

This day commences with a fine breeze from the S.W. steering by the wind on the Starboard tack under all sail (nothing in sight) rigged a new lance pole to one of the Bow Boat lances. Guineard was let out of irons & sent on duty. Washed off decks at 4 o'clock. Wind part the same. Latter part moderate breeze from the S.W. steering by the wind under all sail on the Starboard tack painted the Waist Boat where she had been injured by rafting casks of water set the men (that ran away) to work cleaning the tools in the Cooper Chest.

Sat. Oct. 16th

This day commences with a light breeze from the S.W. steering by the wind on the same tack (nothing in sight) employed in ship's duty. Got King Lizard has come up to act as Boat Steerer. Wind part the same. Latter part light breeze from the S.W. steering by the wind under all sail on the Starboard tack at 10 o'clock lowered 4 Boats for Blackfish and caught 4 for the Waist Boat & 1 to Bow Boat. The Starboard Boat caught a cow fish. Saw 1 sail heading to the S.W.

S.B

Sun. Oct. 17th

This day commences with a light breeze steering the same at 2 o'clock Boats returned to the ship. The Captain shot several birds but did not hurt them much. employed in clearing away the fish. Wind part the same. Latter part light breeze from the S.W. lashed ship at 10 o'clock. 1 sail in sight saw hump back.
