Latter part fresh breeze from the N. heading by the wind on the Starboard tack under double reefed topsails fore sail & fore top-mast stay sail at 4¹² o'clock. called all hands & commenced breaking out the main lower hold to stow the oil pumped. the cask in the ground tier & run the oil into it. nothing in sight

261st

Sat. Nov. 20th 1869

This day commenced with a fresh breeze from the N. & steering the same. employed in stowing down. at 5¹² o'clock had the oil all stowed & decks washed off stowed down 6¹² bbls at 6 o'clock set in thick with rain wore ship at 6 o'clock & for my part I feel rather tired and when I come to think what a fool any one is to engage themselves in this business it nearly makes me sick. I do not desire to follow it much longer. Had part the same. Latter part light breeze from the S.E. steering by the wind made all sail broke out meat opened a cask of pickled onions. I have made 2 iron poles this day

262nd

Sun. Nov. 21st

This day commenced with a light breeze from the S.E. wore ship at 2 o'clock. saw fin back. at sundown took in the light sails & double reefed & hauled up the main sail. Had part the same. Latter part fresh breeze from the E. & steering by the wind under all sail but fore top & sail on the Starboard tack nothing in sight. saw a grampus

Remarks on Board Bk Globe 1869

263rd

Mon Nov. 22nd

This day commenced with a light breeze from the E. by N. backed ship at 2 o'clock. at sundown took in the light sails double reefed & furlled the main sail. Had part the same. Latter part fresh breeze from the N. & steering by the wind on the Starboard tack under topsails courses jib & spanker.

264th

Tues. Nov. 23rd 1869

This day commenced the same nothing in sight. except porpoises at sundown double reefed the top sails & furlled the main sail. Had part the same. Latter part light breeze from the S.E. steering by the wind backed ship at 12 o'clock at 10 o'clock turned the reef out & set jib & spanker had some rain this day. Hoke out corn

265th

Wednesday 24th 1869

This day commenced with baffling wind steering by the wind. nothing in sight at sundown double reefed & took in jib & spanker. Had part the same. Latter part blowing strong from the S.E. took in the fore top sail. saw several fin backs. started a cask of water into the scuttle. But

266th

Thursday 25th

This day commenced with a light gale wore ship at 3 o'clock heading E. & E. saw fin backs. Had part the same. Latter part blowing strong from the S.E. saying too under double reefed main top sail & fore sail nothing in sight. employed in shoe-making
