

At Sea on Board B. E. Globe Cruising

310th day Sunday Jan. 9th - 1870
This day commenced with a light breeze from the S. E. accompanied with rain squalls. Ship heading S. W. by the wind on the Port tack under double reefed top-sails course jib & spanker. 2 sails in sight. (broke out some pickled onions) at sundown took in jib & spanker. Made part the same. Made all sail. 4 sails in sight.

311th day Mon Jan. 10th - 1870
This day commenced with a light breeze from the S. E. steering by the wind under all sail on the Port tack. At sundown jammed the B. E. Cape Horn Pigeon & President Capt. Seabury at sundown took in the light-sails at 10¹² - 0 clock. parted from these vessels. Made part the same. Latter part light breeze from the Westward steering by the wind on the Starboard tack under all sail. 2 sails in sight. started a cask of water into the hull.

312th day Tue Jan. 11th -
This day commenced the same 2 sails in sight employed in waxing awning &c. at sundown shortened sail as usual. Made part the same. Latter part strong breeze from the W. N. W. sent down the main sail for repairs at 6. 0 clock. discovered that the C. H. Pigeon was a whaling nearly ahead of me immediately started for her & made all sail. at 11¹² 0 clock spoke the B. E. Pioneer of New Bedford Capt. Hazard 6 months out with - 115.668

813th day for Spinn. W. Hele Wednesday Jan. 12th - 1870

This day commenced the same sailing with the Pioneer. This vessel spoke the Pigeon & found that she had taken 2 small whale this morning. There in sight at present a cutting employed in mending main-sail. At 6. 0 clock. wore ship & took in the light-sails double reefed. Made part the same. Latter part fresh breeze from the N. W. accompanied with rain squalls. Made all sail. 2 sails in sight. finished mending the main sail & bent it.

314th day Thursday Jan. 13th -
This day commenced the same 2 sails in sight. Broke out water. at sundown took in the light-sails & double reefed B. E. H. Pigeon in sight & boiling. Made part the same. Latter part light breeze from the N. W. steering by the wind under all sail on the Port tack 2 sails in sight.

315th day Friday Jan. 14th -
This day commenced the same 2 sails in sight. At sundown took in the light-sails double reefed (jamming with the Pioneer). Made part squally. Jumbled the main sail done ship at 12. 0 clock. Latter part strong breeze from the N. steering to the S. E. saw a white water about 3 miles distant. ran for it. about an hour did not see it. after ward took in the light-sails. bearing from the S. E. accompanied with rain squalls. saw 2 sails also saw porpoise.
