On Board the Bk Globe Cruising

316th day

Sat. Jan. 13th 1890

20 day is
my birth
day I am
22 years of
age & am
had a clean

This day commenced with a light gale from the N. steering by the wind at the Port back double reefed & furlled the main sail 2 sails in sight at sundown took in jib & fore top sail. Next part the latter part strong breeze from the N & W steering by the wind under hold top sails courses jibe spanker & gaff top sail 2 sails in sight (broke out water) had a rain squall.

317th day

Sun. Jan. 14th 1890

This day commenced the same. 1 sail in sight at 8 o'clock lashed ship at sundown took in the light sail double reefed & furlled the main sail. Next part the same. Latter part light breeze from the N.W. made all sail 6 sails in sight all of them whales. at 8 o'clock discovered these vessels to be a whaling gear chase for the whale at 10 o'clock the Bow Boat struck a 40 lb whale which had an iron ring in its head about 30 fathoms of line attached to the iron the whale run to the leeward. Every last.

318th day

Lat 33.56 L Mon. Jan. 15th 1890

This day commenced the same at 4 o'clock the whale turned up at 6 o'clock had him along side & fluked sent up the tackle broke out feed & pork. lost 2 cans today. Bk. *Minerva* length Bk. *Crossfield* Bk. *President* in sight and several other unknown whaling Long L. 15 W

Next part light breeze from the S.W. Boat steering heading the water at 4 o'clock called all Latta part hands & broke out the blubber room and at 5 o'clock hooked on to the whale had him in on deck at 9 o'clock sent down the tackle all hands employed in clearing away the head & jaw 5 sails in sight.

319th day

Tuesday Jan. 16th 1890

This day commenced the same 5 sails in sight cleared up decks & started the work set the fore top sail & furlled jib & spanker steering by the wind on the Starboard tack. Set the watch at 6 o'clock. Starboard Watch first watch on deck. Next part boiling in the head (calm) Latter part fresh breeze from the S.W. steering by the wind set the reefs out & set jibe spanker & gaff top sail 10 schooners in sight and a whaling Bk. finished boiling on the head turned up 21 blb commenced on the body broke out water

320th day

Wednesday 17th 1890

This day commenced with a strong breeze from the S.W. heading by the wind under the same sail on the Starboard tack 2 sails in sight all hands employed in (boiling) double reefed the top sails & hove in jib & spanker steering up strong. Next part fresh breeze accompanied with rain squall at 10 o'clock finished boiling & put on the stew. & cleared up the deck. Latter part blowing a gale from the W called all hands at 5 o'clock & washed off. took up the bow Boat & took the bare out. took the pots of fat lean off & secured things for a gale of wind

look in the fore top sail were ship at 12
