

On Board B^k Globe. Cruising

321th

Thursday 20th 1870

This day commences with a gale of wind from the W. laying too on the Port tack under double reefed main top sail fore sail & stay sail. 1 schooner in sight. put extra lashings on the oil casks (blowing heavy). No id part blowing a gale. Latter part strong breeze from the S.W. steering by the wind ~~out~~ the reef out & set the main sail jib & spanker saw 1 sail

322th

Friday 21st 1870

This day commences the same 1 schooner in sight. killed a pig at 6¹/₂ o'clock spoke the schooner M. D. Leach of Provincetown Capt. Wood 12 months out with 10 bbls sperm at sundown double reefed the top sails & furled the main sail jib & spanker. No id part blowing fresh. Latter part moderate breeze from the N. & E. steering by the wind under double reefed top sails fore sail jib & spanker. called all hands at day light and commenced stowing down at 12 o'clock had the oil all stowed. Stowed down 44 bbls & 15 gallons. 3 sails in sight

323rd

Sat. Jan. 22nd 1870

This day commences with a moderate breeze from the S.W. stowed off the hold. & washed off the ship. wore ship at 1 o'clock. & set the reef out & set flying jib & gaff top sail (3 sails in sight) at sundown shortened sail as usual. No id part the same Latter part light breeze from the N. & W. steering by the wind under all sail but fore top sail 3 sails in sight. Patched the fousail

for Sperm Whales. Jan. 1870

324th day

Sun Jan. 23rd

This day commences the same 2 sails in sight. employed in sailoring too at sundown shortened sail No id part the same Latter part strong breeze from the N. & W. steering by the wind under double reefed top sails courses jib & spanker. 3 sails in sight.

325th

Mon Jan. 24th 1870

This day commences the same 2 sails in sight. at sundown took on jib spanker & main sail & wore ship. No id part the same Latter part light breeze from the S. E. steering by the wind under double reefed top sails fore sail jib & spanker. 2 sails in sight. (killed a pig) (raining) broke out Bread Meat & Water

326th

Tuesday Jan. 25th

This day commences the same 4 whales in sight. Made all sail except main sail & fore top & sail. steering to the W. with a light breeze from the S. E. at sundown shortened sail as usual. No id part the same. Latter part light breeze from the W. steering by the wind under all sail 6 sails in sight.

327th

Wednes Jan. 26th

This day commences the same at 12 o'clock spoke & summoned the ship Minerva. Length 40 ft. Howland at sundown shortened sail as usual at the same time Bk Triton Capt. Snell of New Bedford 380 bbls oil the Minerva. saw grampuses & showed their boats thinking they were sperm whales
