

On Board B^t Globe off St. Helena

436th

Sun May 13th/70

This day commences with a fresh breeze from the S.E. (heading in & off shore) under the same sail. Took off the fore-lean oil & cleaned the pots out. & coopered the oil. (Saw several sails) gave the men their molasses. At 6.0 o'clock set the reef out. At 10.00 part the same Latter part-fresh trader (arriving). Saw 4 sails Land about 10 miles distant.

437th

Mon. May 16th/70

This day commences the same saw 3 sails at sundown took in the light-sails and double reefed the top-sails. At 10.00 part the same Latter part-light-trader saw a Bark to the windward a boiling broke out vinegar.

438th

Tues. May 17th/70

This day commences the same. Turn off to the Land and huffed to at 1.0 o'clock standing off shore under double reefed top-sails. At 10.00 part the same Latter part-strong breeze standing in shore set the reef out of the main-top-sail & set chain top-sail heading in for the Harbor at 1.00 o'clock sent the waist-boat in for the Capt. At 11.0 o'clock the Boat returned at 1.0 o'clock. The Boat left the ship for the shore again.

439th

Wednesday May 18th

This day commences the same Boat returned to the ship at 4.0 o'clock and left for shore again at 4.20 o'clock. Broke out Beef & Water. At 5.20 o'clock the Boat returned.

To the Ship with galins (the Storage Boy) the Capt. remaining ashore. At 10.00 part the same. Latter part-fresh breeze from the S.E. run down off the Harbor and lowered the Bow Boat and started for the shore after pulling a short distance discovered a Boat a pulling towards the ship. Halted the Boat and found it to be a Boat from the shore with the Capt. took the Capt. from the Boat and returned to the ship. After coming aboard the Capt. inquired why the men should refuse duty and they said that they did not like the late proceedings that had taken place. The Capt. told them that he would give them until 12.0 o'clock to turn to their duty and if they then refused he should adopt a method of his own plan. double reefed the main-top-sail standing off shore furling the main sail.

440th

Thursday 19th/70

This day commences with fresh trader standing off shore on the Starboard tack at the main sail at 12.0 o'clock. All the fore-mast head was mustered on the quarter deck in order to give an account of their stores. Some testified to one thing and some another which is not worthy of remark. But after a short consultation they all turned to their former duty. Therefore manured the mast head & broke out 4 lb Sugar and opened a Keg of Butter. Saw 1 sail. At 1.00 part the same Latter part-light-trader standing in shore broke out rice & Beans. Watch employed in coopering & filling the casks of oil. Nothing in sight. Supplied the men with clothing & tobacco. Fine weather.
