

On Board Bk. Globe Off St. Helena

441st

Friday May 20th/70

This day commences with fine weather cruising off the windward of the Island nothing in sight. I have moved into the Cabin acting as 4th Mate - am to head the Starboard Bow Boat. Sam Williams is to steer the Life 2nd mate (Mr McClellan) and Coosin the late Chief Mate (Mr Coggeshall) Joseph King is to steer the Bow Boat. The 3rd Mate keeps his own Boat-steerer. Mid part fine weather. Latter part moderate breeze made all sail working up to the windward of the Land saw porpoise all hands employed in stowing down oil in the fore hold. Broke out shovels the cooper employed in setting them up. at 12 o'clock had the oil all stowed down & the hold stowed off. Stowed down 33 bbls & 11 gallons. broke out a cask of Flour and put it in the clutter room.

442nd

Sat. May 21st/70

This day commences with fine weather cooper employed in setting up shooks. Mid part light trade took in the light sails. Latter part strong trade set the flying jib & gaff top sail. steering by the wind on the Port tack land about 20 miles distant. cooper employed in flying casks. saw a Whaling Brig. Stowed some empty casks in the fore hold.

Off St. Helena. Cruising

443rd

Sun May 22nd

This day begins the same. Cooper & the Capt. employed in setting up shooks saw 1 sail. Mid part - the same Latter part strong trade steering by the wind under the top sail courses jib & spanker saw 3 whalers.

444th

Mon. May 23rd/70

This day commences with strong trade (cruising) at 3 1/2 o'clock passed a Black painted (cream color) supposit to be the John F. West. at sundown took in the flying jib. Mid part - Land strong trade. Latter part strong trade not steering by the wind under top sail visible courses jib & spanker. cooper & the Capt. employed in flying casks. broke out the after hold for pork. also broke out flags & a new jib. Saw 2 sail (Whalers)

445th

Tues May 24th

This day commences the same steering the same. finished the casks and stowed them below. washed the rails off. at sundown double reefed the top sails. saw 2 whalers. At 11 part the same Latter part light trade steering by the wind on the Starboard tack under top sail courses jib spanker & gaff top sail. (bent a new jib). saw 1 sail.

446th

Wednesday May 25th/70

This day commences with fine weather packed ship at 3 o'clock set up the Port jib & flying jib gaff at sundown took in the light sails & double reefed. Mid part the same. Latter part light breeze. saw 2 sail at sunset & the light sails.
