

Remarks on Board Bth Globe at Anchor

470th day

Sat June 18th

This day commences with a light breeze from the S.W. ship heading S.E. under all sail on the Starboard tack. Saw porpoise. Broke No id part the same. Latter part light out. Breeze from the S.W. steering to the East & Water under all sail. (Saw porpoise) Broke out Water & Flour. Lat 7.48 & Long 11.28

471th

Sun June 19th/70

This day begins with fine weather steering E. under all sail (saw porpoise) coiled down 48 fathoms of cordage to carry in the Boats for hump Backing. fitted 2. Cuts 48 fathoms in each cut. No id part moderate breeze from the S.W. steering under all sail. at 12 o'clock hauled up the courses & duffed to the wind on the Starboard tack. Latter part light breeze from the S.W. steering to the East under all sail. Lat 7.08 & Long 12.13.6

472nd

Mon June 20th/70

This day commences with fine weather heading in shore under all sail. at 1 o'clock sounded in 40 fathoms of water saw several Diamond fish also saw a hump Back and several sharks at 2 1/2 o'clock raised the Land bearing East. shortly after raised a schooner ahead and saw her come to anchor got every thing in readiness to come to anchor. No id part nearly calm at 7 o'clock let go the Starboard anchor in about 15 fathoms of water took on the light sail furlled the main sail & clued down the top sails. Land about 12 miles distant. Latter part

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light breeze from the S.W. lying to anchor raised a hump Back close to the ship immediately lowered the Starboard Starboard & Bow Boats & gave chase. chased him about an hour. and returned to the ship without success. at 9 o'clock the Captⁿ of the Washington Steamer came aboard the said schooner has taken 3 whales here on the coast. making 97 bbls. cooper employed in repairing the Bow davit.

473rd

Tues June 21st/70

This day commences with a light breeze from the S.W. at 3 o'clock got under weigh made all sail (except mainsail) and stood in shore within 9 miles and came to anchor furlled the light sails and clued down the top sails. Saw 2 hump Backs after sundown. (The W. Steamer at anchor near by. divided the crew into 6 watches the Officers & Boat-Steers heading the watches. No id part fine weather. Latter part calm. employed in fitting Boat sails put a cloth in each the Starboard & Waist Boat sails. the Captⁿ & 8 Boats crew aboard of the schooner gaming.

474th

Wednes June 22nd/70

This day commences with a light breeze from the S.W. at 3 1/2 o'clock raised 2 hump Backs lowered 3 Boats from the ship (the schooner lowering 2 the same time) & gave chase until sundown & returned without success. whales acting rather shy. No id part fine weather. Latter part employed in making Boats masts for the Starboard & Starboard Boats. Broke out the lumber rack in the main hold.
