

Remarks on Board Bk. Globe on the 1870

Thursday June 23rd

This day commenced with a light breeze from the N.W. employed in making Boats mast at 12 o'clock raised a whale immediately lowered the Leeward Mast & Bow Boat and gave chase the Mast Boat went on to a large bow but did not succeed in striking. I chased him off shore & returned to the ship with poor success. Mid part the same Leeward part light breeze from the N.W. cooper employed in making sprits for the Boats at 9 o'clock the Captain took the Bow Boat & crew & left the ship on a fishing excursion at 12 o'clock returned to the ship with about 75 fish

1870

Friday June 24th

This day commenced with a light breeze from the N.W. at 7 o'clock the same gang started on another fishing excursion returned at 3 1/2 o'clock with about 150 fish (dressed the fish after supper) Mid part fine weather. Latter part light breeze from the E.S.E. at 8 o'clock the Captain & a Boats crew left the ship on a fishing excursion caught about 775 fish went aboard of the Schooner (W.F.) to dinner

Sat. June 25th

This day commenced with fine weather Boat returned from fishing at 4 o'clock Mid part fine weather. Latter part calm Mr. Riley & a Boats crew started on a fishing excursion the Boat returned at 7 o'clock Captain of the Schooner & a Boats crew

Coast of Africa Hump Backing

Sun June 26th/70

This day commenced with a light breeze from the S.W. Broke out Flour & Bread out Boats. Capt. Bradley went aboard at 3 1/2 o'clock. James Murray & the Portuguese (John) got into a row about some Bread the Capt. furnished them by putting them in the rigging (Saw Cow fish) Mid part the same Leeward part light breeze from the S.W. at 7 o'clock got under weigh & made all sail cruising up and down the coast at 9 1/2 o'clock raised 2 whales lowered & chased them until 1 o'clock & returned to the ship with poor success

478th

Mon June 27th/70

This day began with fine weather at 2 o'clock raised 2 whales lowered & chased them until sun down & returned with poor success (spoke the English Steamer) at sun down anchored the ship & furlled the light sail & chued down the top sails the W. Freeman near by Capt. Bradley came aboard at sun down Mid part the same breeze returned to the Schooner at 8 o'clock. Latter part calm at 7 1/2 o'clock raised 2 hump back lowered all the Boats & gave chase at 8 o'clock the Leeward Boat struck the whale run off shore about 20 miles the Cooper the Bow Boat caught up with the last Boat at 11 o'clock shortly after the iron vessel off therefore lost the whale undelivered the Schooner W. Freeman lowered her Boats for the same whale the Capt. lowered in the Bow Boat

the 2nd boat employed in making sprits for the Boats but at 12 o'clock the crew was

saw a hump back but did not lower at being to late in the day

477th

saw a hump back at 5 1/2 o'clock going quick to the leeward caught 69 fish
