

On Board Bk Globe on the Coast of Africa

490th

Friday July 8th

This day commences with a light breeze heading up the coast under all sail. (caught about 65 fish this day) at 3.0 o'clock raised a whale lowered 3 Boats and gave chase shortly after the Schooner W. Freeman lowered for the whale and struck (we returned to the ship with four success) at sundown anchored the ship. Mid part fine weather latter part light breeze started the works at 7.0 o'clock

491st

Sat. July 9th

This day commences with fine weather lowered 3 Boats for whaling & the Starboard Boat struck a large one but had to cut from him. Boats returned to the ship at 5.0 o'clock spoke the Schooner W. Freeman the whale she struck last night - they lost by the line parting at 8.0 o'clock came to anchor & pulled the light sails. Mid part good weather at 11.0 o'clock finished boiling turned up 28. bbls (Starboard with the first watch out) Latter part fine breeze at 8.0 o'clock commenced stowing down oil in the fore hold at 7.0 o'clock got underway standing in shore under all sail (anchored again at 10.0 o'clock)

492nd

Sun. July 10th

This day commences with a light breeze at 5.12 o'clock knocked off work stowed down about 60. bbls in the fore peak. (Capt. Brady came aboard) Mid part fine weather Latter part fresh breeze from the S.E. at 8.0 o'clock raised

Whaling Brackings 1870

Whale got the ship underway and stood in shore lowered all 4 Boats and gave chase at 9.0 o'clock the Starboard Boat struck a Bull Whale and after hanging to him for about an hour the iron drew. Drack sail on the Boat & struck the same whale again. The West Boat struck the whale 2nd Boat & killed him took the whale along side at 11.12 o'clock

493rd

Mon July 11th

This day begins with a fine breeze at 12.12 o'clock commenced cutting in at 3.0 o'clock had him in on deck - at sundown had the deck all cleared up. Mid part good weather Latter part good weather started the works at 8.0 o'clock discovered one of the pots a leaking bailed it down & bailed pickle in it in order to stop the leak. Brig Myra of Sag Harbor arrived here last night - saw her boat a whaling today

494th

Tuesday July 12th

This day commences with a light breeze at 12.12 o'clock got underway some standing in shore at 2.0 o'clock lowered 3 Boats for 2 Whaling back chased one of them until 4.12 o'clock & returned to the ship have been a boiling in a large pot today as we have not succeeded in stopping the leak in the other yet. at 5.12 o'clock anchored the ship. Mid part good weather Latter part light breeze all hands employed in boiling Capt. Babcock (of the Myra) came aboard
