

Remarks on Board Bk. Globe

301st

July Thue 19th - 1870

This day commences with fine weather at 12 1/2 o'clock raised a whale near the ship lowered the Waist & Bow Boats and gave chase until 3 o'clock & then returned to the ship. after coming aboard finished stowing down. at 4 o'clock discovered that one of our Boats was fast immediately lowered the Bow & Waist Boats & gave chase for the fast Boat after pulling for some time came up with the Boat and the Waist Boat struck a loose one which was running with the fast one the last one struck started off shore running fast. at 8 1/2 o'clock turned him up at 9 o'clock the Onet whale turned up & sunk the one struck last sunk also at 9 o'clock the Bow Boat left the whale & started for the ship went aboard of the Schooner W. H. and got some supper at 10 o'clock left the schooner for the Globe at 12 o'clock arrived aboard Cooper got the ship underweigh and stood for the Boat. at 8 o'clock he anchored the ship near by the whale left 2 Boats with the whale near the ship & left Mor Riley with the one off shore. Mid part good weather latter part good weather at 8 o'clock hauled the whale up. got the ship underweigh & took the whale along side. at 8 1/2 o'clock sent the Bow Boat to the whale off shore with provisions for the Waist Boat crew cut the whale in & made all sail for the other whale

On the Coast of Africa

302nd

July Wednesday 20th

This day commenced with a light breeze at 1 1/2 o'clock hauled the whale Brig Nagasack. & commenced stowing the whale Schooner towards the ship. at 4 1/2 o'clock the wind died away to a calm sent all the Boats from the ship to tow the whale Boiling at sundown hauled him along side. anchored the ship. Mid part fine weather latter part fine weather at 8 o'clock commenced cutting at 10 1/2 o'clock had him on deck. the Brig & Schooner near by us

303rd

July Thursday 21st

This day commences with fine weather at 12 o'clock started the work. at sundown came to anchor got under weigh at 12 o'clock. at sundown Capt. Braly came aboard & got some clothing out of the ship cash for his men. Mid part Boiling latter part good weather all hands employed in boiling. This day discharged John L. Price to take passage home in the Schooner Washington. also shipped Cornelius Watson as Boat Stewer. late fore mast hand of the schooner. the schooner left here for home today. saw the Brig Bear strike a whale

304th

July Friday 22nd

This day commenced with fine weather at 5 o'clock finished boiling turned up 52 bls. Mid part the same latter part calm at day light called all hands & washed off. after breakfast all 4 Boats left the ship on a days cruise. saw the Brig take 2 whales today
