

Remarks on Board Bk Globe

526th

Aug. Sat. 13th / 70

This day commenced with fine weather at 2 1/2 o'clock took the whale along side anchored (saw an English man of war) at 3 1/2 o'clock the ship commenced cutting after cutting in a few minutes the loggers shipped out and the whale drunk looked on to the other whale and cut him in. At 4 o'clock fine weather tried to haul the whale up but could not make it out. At 5 o'clock fine weather at 6 1/2 o'clock hauled the whale up & commenced cutting at 9 o'clock had him in on deck (started the work)

527th

Aug. Sun. 14th / 70

This day commenced with a fresh breeze at 11 1/2 o'clock the Starboard & Bow Boats left the ship on a cruise in shore at 2 1/2 o'clock the Bow Boat struck the whale started off shore running very fast the Waist Boat lowered from the ship and came to my assistance fastened the Waist Boat to the whale after running about an hour and a half my iron broke off & the Waist Boat again fastened on to the whale had not been fast long when the iron broke fastened again to the whale fired a bomb into him which caused him to behave better at 5 1/2 o'clock turned up the Starboard Boat arrived to us the same time after the whale the Waist Boat went aboard the ship. At 6 o'clock fine weather hooked on to the whale & towed him in shore about 2 hours & anchored the whale in for my part I am in an awful condition

Camp Backing on the Coast

Later part good weather at 8 o'clock the Waist Boat came to us with provisions &c. all 3 Boats commenced bringing the whale in shore (the ship at 7 o'clock got underway made all sail & stood for us at 12 1/2 o'clock took the whale along side & fluked him the Starboard Boat crew have the afternoon below saw the Triton a sailing to the windward

528th

Aug. Mon. 15th / 70

This day commenced with fine weather took the whale along side at 12 1/2 o'clock the Starboard and Bow & Starboard Boats came below saw the Triton to the windward a sailing at sundown anchored & chud up the topside Mord part the same (sailing) Later part fine weather at 9 o'clock cooled down & commenced cutting saw the Triton heading down the coast emptied fresh water casks for oil

529th

Aug. Tues. 16th / 70

This day commenced with fine weather at 8 1/2 o'clock had the whale in immediately started the work started the Park from the cask into barrels in order to have the cask for oil emptied the flag cask. Mid part good weather sailing. Later part calm at day light finished sailing on the last whale which turned up about 60 blk & commenced on the other Starboard water employed in sailing (Port water below)
