

Remarks on Board Bk Globe

541st

Sun Aug 28th 1870

This day commences with a fresh breeze turned finished boiling at 2 o'clock. lowered the Mast & 2 Harbored Boats for whale men the ship at 3 o'clock the Boat Boat struck and the iron drew. we have been chasing whales all this day. but all was going quick. at 3 1/2 o'clock all the Boats returned to the ship without success. at sundown came to anchor in 13 fathoms of water. No id part the same latter part light breeze at 7 1/2 o'clock lowered all the Boats for a day's cruise. at 8 o'clock the Mast Boat struck a 20 bl whale & pulled up to the fast Boat & gave her my camp the whale started off shore running very fast had been fast about 1/2 an hour when the iron drew.

542nd

Mon Aug 29th 1870

This day commences with a light breeze chased several whales but they was quick & died very ship. at 3 o'clock I went on to a 40 bl whale & the Boat caught 14 large blower missed him with both irons at 6 o'clock Boats returned to the ship with hard luck. at sundown fired the top sails. No id part the same latter part fresh breeze from the S & E. at 8 o'clock got underway made all sail & stood off shore for Anabona all hands employed in clearing up deck broke out the new shoes Cooper employed in setting them up saw 2 hump backs saw 1 full

From the Coast to Anabona

543rd

Tues Aug 30th 1870

This day begins with a light breeze from the S & E steering by the wind on the Port tack and all sail (fair well to the Coast of Africa) Cooper engaged in setting up Chutes has set up 10 this day sent down the cutting cables & stored them below No id part steering West under all sail. Light part moderate breeze from the S & W steering by the wind under all sail Cooper employed in flagging casks saw fin back Lat. 3. 22 South Long 8. 50 East

544th

Wednesday Aug 31st 1870

This day commences the same broke out 2 bundles of shoes & the Cooper set them stored up saw fin & hump backs stored the empty casks below. No id part the same latter part light breeze from the S & W steering N.W under all sail all hands employed in stowing down oil in the fore hold hoisted the casks of meat out of the fore hold in order to take the meat out & put it into barrels to store in the After hold

545th

Thursday Sept 1st 1870

This day commences the same stored 8 new casks in the fore hold for fresh water (nothing in sight to day) there is 4 men off duty on the account of sickness No id part steering N.W under all sail. Light part light breeze from the S & W steering to the S & W under all sail to the meat out of the casks & put it into barrels and stored it in the after hold Lat
