Continued Remarks on Board Bk Globe

hauled up
cable & got
the anchor
off the bow

Letter part moderate breeze from
the S.W. made all sail standing in shore land
about 30 miles distant

This day commenced with a light breeze
from the N.W. at 2 1/2 o'clock called all
hands & got in readiness to anchor. at 3 -
o'clock came to anchor in (Fish Bay) in
6 fathoms of water filled the dail & broke
out Casks to cap for water also cleaned the
muzzle from the bows of the ship. Capt.
went ashore and returned to the ship at sun-
down with fish & sweet-potatoes Mid part
very moderate Letter part the same
at 6 o'clock rafted 17 casks & landed them
ashore & filled them with water sold
some plank spars & barrels
bought off 100 lbs of Onions

Mon Feb 13th

The mail
collected
them down
to the beach
& rafted
them but was
not able to
get them off
as the tide was
falling. therefore
rolled them
above high water
mark and returned
to the ship & put up
the potato-ben &
painted the bender
Mid part moderate
breeze from the S.W.
Letter part calm
or day light & Boat
left the ship for the
raft at 8 1/2 o'clock
returned to the ship
with the raft after
getting breakfast
commenced stowing
down the water in
the fore hold caught
a big fish from along
side pummed my finger
knocking the nail off
which prevented my
writing as usual

1871

This day commenced with a moderate
breeze from S.W. at 4 1/2 o'clock finished
stowing the water broke out 15 barrel
to take ashore to trade Mid part
moderate Letter part fine weather
look aboard 100 bushels of Sweet
potatoes & some fish meat. took ashore
20 barrels 3 spars, 1/2 pane, lamps & blankets
to trade took ashore 100 fresh fish & sold
them at 1/2 cent per lb took aboard 200 lbs of
Sugar & 2 sacks of Beans

Wednesday Feb 15th

This day commenced the same as the
last - 1 line above. Mid part moderate
weather Letter part light breeze from the
Southward at 6 1/2 o'clock took our anchor
the fish and proceeded our way out to sea under
all sail all hands engaged in stowing
the anchor & chain

Thurs Feb 16th

This day commenced with a light
breeze from the S.W. steering by the
wind under all sail on the Port tack
Mid part moderate Letter part light
breeze from the S.W. ship heading W
our water by N. under all sail

Friday Feb 17th

This day commenced with a fresh breeze
from the S.W. steering by the wind on
the Port tack at sundown both in the
light dail Mid part ship heading
W by S Letter part fresh breeze from
the S.W. steering by the wind under
all sail saw jumbies & Albatross
